Greetings,

As we approach the middle of the 2<sup>nd</sup> trimester I would like to take the opportunity to remind you of a few important items regarding student progress and conferences. With our move to "proficiency based learning" students need to be reminded that there are frequent opportunities to make up or retake assessments during intramural times and after school. Each grade level provides students with the



opportunity to come in during their intramural time for assistance and retakes at least 4 days per week. Also, on Tuesdays and Thursdays we have our after school tutoring available and on Wednesdays we have a "homework help" time where students have a place to complete assignments with teachers assisting. These programs run from the end of school until 5:20 pm and are dependent upon our activity bus schedule. We have experienced that those students who utilize this time have a greater chance of keeping up on work and also performing better on assessments.

We will be hosting our winter conferences on Feb 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> with our usual format, offering arena conferencing each evening with prearranged staffings during the day. If you would like to schedule a "staffing" conference please notify our office as soon as possible to be placed into the schedule. Those spots fill fast and any additional openings are filled on a first come first serve basis after our teacher initiated requests are scheduled.

Lastly, I would like to request that you help us to impress upon your student the importance of performing their best on the upcoming OAKS state assessment. Their performance on these tests , taken in reading, math, science and writing, will have a significant bearing on their academic future . It is necessary to instill the importance of achievement at all times but please help us emphasize to them that building the necessary skills to perform well now will make it easier for them in high school. It will also be beneficial that passing the state assessment in high school will be a requirement in order to obtain a diploma.

### **7<sup>™</sup> GRADERS**

Oregon Law added new requirements for immunizations as of the 2008/2009 school year. All 7<sup>th</sup> graders who have not met the requirements need to have one additional vaccine or an appropriate medical or religious exemption prior to the exclusion date in February. Please check your students records to be sure he/she has the following:

## Tdap Vaccine – 1 dose

Your student will need one dose of Tdap if it has been at least 5 years since receiving their last DTaP vaccine. All updated information should be sent to Fleming Middle School. Please call (541) 476-8284 if we can be of any assistance or answer any questions for you.

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### **Program To Help Families In Transition**

Dear parents/Guardians,

I am Kathleen Fain, the Family Advocate for Fleming Middle School. The purpose of the Family Advocate is to help students overcome barriers to success. I will try to help students acquire jackets, clothing, school supplies, hygiene supplies, glasses, dental appointments, haircuts, etc. I will also advocate for students: For example, helping them get testing or counseling, acquiring birth certificates, and other related services.

In addition, there is a federal law called the McKinney-Vento Actwhich gives additional assistance to students that meet the federal definitions of "homeless" which include:

- Living in a home with no heat or running water
- Staying with friends or other relatives due to economic hardships or loss of housing
- Fleeing a domestic violence situation
- Living in a car, van, bus, tent or other non-permanent structure

Living in one of the above situations may also entitle a student to:

Transportation to their home school should homelessness require a move

Immediate enrollment, even if there are issues, such as not having in hand:

A birth certificate(s) for the child(ren)

Immunizations forms

Please help me identify any students with specific needs that may be in your care. Do you have a student that
