The Environmental Protection Agency came here to inspect our fuel tanks on November 5th we had everything in order and all the paperwork they needed but they would like us to still try to get a state inspection through Department of Environmental Quality if they are able to come up sometime before December 31st. But we are trying to get ahold of the Tribe to get the approval for them to come here to get our annual inspection done. We are still working on trying to get them here at this time.

We has a snow storm on November 7th and we came in on Monday November 9th to plow our parking lot so our buses could get out to get food for delivery. We delivered town routes only this day. Then we delivered out of town on Tuesday November 8th so everyone still got their normal delivery just on 2 different days.

We been working remotely from home as much as possible. The secretary came in each day to get caught up on her work and one mechanic came in to sanitize and disinfect with our electrostatic sprayer. He sprays the building and all the buses and district vehicles that are used on food delivery days. Then we usually will have a bus driver that will come in help wipe things down and mop the floors or sometimes the Secretary will do this too.

The mechanics got our 1 ton pickup back and put the plow on it so when we get the next storm we will be able to continue to plow where needed. The mechanics put a transmission in the suburban so we will have another vehicle to use when the weather gets bad to help haul food when needed.

The mechanics picked up the activity bus that has been in Cutbank at Al's diesel it finally got fixed. They had to replace a computer that had to do with the air and the charging system. It was faulty and this caused a hole to get burned in the back of the alternator so it had to get replaced and reprogram the computer.
