1. Provide a DETAILED RATIONALE explaining how the waiver will enhance student learning opportunities, promote innovation or increase equitable access to effective teachers. Include information about the problem or obstacle, if any, the waiver will help the district overcome.

Several member school districts of the Crowley's Ridge Service Cooperative are collectively and separately requesting a waiver from A.C.A. 6-10-106, which establishes the first allowable day of class as the Monday of the week that contains August 19. For the 2023-2024 school year that date will be Monday, August 19.

The specific waiver being requested is to allow <u>Trumann School District</u> (the applying school district) to set their first day of class to be no earlier than <u>Monday</u>. August 9.

The law as presently constructed results in a wide swing in the allowable opening date of school. At the earliest, it can be August 14, which was the case this year—fall of 2023. The latest possible first day is August 20 which, under the law will be — fall of 2029. This waiver would next year allow school to open on the same relative date as this year.

The advantages of this waiver are several:

- The fall and spring semesters would be closer to the same length (with a break between the semesters being Christmas Break). Without this waiver, fall semester for Trumann School District (4 day school week) will be 67 days white spring semester will be 76 days, a difference of 9 days. With the waiver the fall semester will be 72 days and the spring semester 71 days, a difference of only 1 day. The more unbalanced that semesters are, the greater is the issue for classes that are one semester in length.
- The alternative solution for unbalanced semesters is to not end fall semester until after Christmas break. This results in final exams shortly after two weeks out of school, and the possibility of exams being repeatedly postponed due to winter weather.
- This waiver will give greater assurance of school ending in late May rather than extending into June. Some research indicates a decrease in learning past the Memorial Day Holiday.

- Beginning school earlier automatically results in more days of instruction prior to spring testing.
 More days of instruction will result in higher test scores,
- Activities such as football will begin next fall on the same relative date as they did this fall, with
 or without the waiver, therefore a large number of students will already be on campus to
 practice and prepare for their activities, regardless of the opening date of school. In addition to
 students that play football, this would include students that are participants in groups such as
 volleyball, band, cheer, Student Council and National Honor Society, as well as others.
- The granting of this waiver does not affect any other law, rule or procedure. The school year
 will remain the same length. It simply allows a district to continue with a school calendar that is
 structured as closely as possible to the current one, and avoids the dramatic change to the
 calendar which must result without the waiver.

There will not be a loss of services for students under this waiver.

3. Provide a detailed explanation of how the district will monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of the waiver.

The district will monitor student assessment results and student attendance data related to the earlier start of the school year by no more than five days. The movement of the start date should have a positive effect on state assessment scores and student attendance. The advantage is having more student instruction days prior to the state assessment.

WHEREAS the Trumann School District Board of Directors is committed to providing a high-quality education to all students within the district;

WHEREAS, certain circumstances or regulations may require the district to seek waivers to better address the unique needs or challenges faced by the district;

WHEREAS, Trumann School District requests via an ACT 1240 Waiver for an Early Calendar Start, one full week before what is currently allowed by law, A.C.A. 6-10-106, (no earlier than August 9) for the next five years;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Trumann School Board Hereby authorizes The District administration to formally request a walver for an Early Calendar Start via an ACT 1240 Walver from A.C.A. 6-10-106;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent or designee is authorized to take all necessary steps and actions to submit the waiver request, including providing any additional information or documentation required by the relevant authorities;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Directors Expresses its support for the waiver request and acknowledges the importance of flexibility in addressing the unique needs and circumstances of the district.

This resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
