It is recommended that the United ISD Board of Trustees approve First and Final Reading of Policy EIF (LOCAL): Academic Achievement Graduation.

## PROPOSED REVISIONS

<u>COURSE REQUIREMENTS</u>	<u>To graduate, a student must complete the courses required by the District in addition to those mandated by the state.</u>
<u>GRADUATION PROGRAMS INSTITUTED PRIOR TO 2014–15</u>	<u>Students enrolled in high school prior to the 2014–15 school year may graduate under state programs other than the foundation program, including the Minimum Program, the Recommended Program, and the Advanced/Distinguished Achievement Program. The courses required for each of these programs shall be listed in appropriate publications. The District credit requirements under these programs are listed below.</u>
MINIMUM PROGRAM	For students who entered grade 9 prior to the 2012–13 school year, the District requires no additional credits for graduation under the Minimum Program beyond the number mandated by the state.  Beginning with students who entered grade 9 in the 2012–13 school year, the District requires completion of four credits in addition to the number required by the state for graduation under the Minimum Program, <u>for a total of 26 credits. The additional credits shall include one science credit, one mathematics credit, and two elective credits. The campus student support team shall determine whether waiving the four additional credit requirements is appropriate for the student.</u> [See EIF(REGULATION)]
RECOMMENDED PROGRAM	For students who entered grade 9 prior to the 2012–13 school year, the District requires no additional credits for graduation under the Recommended Program beyond the number mandated by the state.  Beginning with students who entered grade 9 in the 2012–13 school year, the District requires completion of four credits in addition to the number required by the state for graduation under the Recommended Program, <u>for a total of 30 credits. The additional credits shall be electives.</u>
ADVANCED / DISTINGUISHED ACHIEVEMENT PROGRAM	For students who entered grade 9 prior to the 2012–13 school year, the District requires no additional credits for graduation under the Advanced/Distinguished Achievement Program beyond the number mandated by the state.  Beginning with students who entered grade 9 in the 2012–13 school year, the District requires completion of four credits in addition to the number required by the state for graduation under the Advanced/Distinguished Achievement Program, <u>for a total of 30 credits. The additional credits shall be electives.</u>

MAGNET PROGRAM COURSE REQUIREMENTS	The District requires completion of additional credits beyond the number mandated by the state for graduation from the District's magnet program under the Advanced/Distinguished Achievement Program. The list of courses required for each of the magnet programs <del>may be found</del> <ins>shall be maintained</ins> in administrative regulations. [See EIF(REGULATION)]
READING CREDITS	The District shall offer up to 3 credits of reading for state graduation credit. The Superintendent or designee shall be responsible for establishing procedures to assess individual student needs and evaluate student progress and shall monitor instructional activities to ensure that student needs are met. Students shall be identified as eligible to earn reading credit based on: <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Recommendation by a teacher or counselor.</li><li>2. Scores on assessment instruments and/or achievement tests.</li></ol>
<u>FOUNDATION PROGRAM</u>	<u>The courses that satisfy District requirements under the foundation program, including courses for the distinguished level of achievement and courses for endorsements offered by the District, shall be listed in appropriate District publications.</u>
<u>WITHOUT AN ENDORSEMENT</u>	<u>The District requires completion of 4 credits in addition to the number required by the state for graduation under the foundation program without an endorsement. Graduation under the foundation program without an endorsement shall be permitted only as authorized under state law and rules.</u>
<u>WITH AN ENDORSEMENT</u>	<u>The District requires completion of 4 credits in addition to the number required by the state for graduation under the foundation program with an endorsement.</u>
<u>DISTINGUISHED LEVEL OF ACHIEVEMENT</u>	<u>The District requires completion of 4 credits in addition to the number required by the state for graduation under the foundation program with the distinguished level of achievement.</u>
<u>NO FINE ARTS SUBSTITUTIONS</u>	<u>The District shall not award state graduation credit in fine arts for participation in a community-based fine arts program.</u>
PHYSICAL EDUCATION SUBSTITUTIONS	<u>To the extent permitted by state rules applicable to the student's graduation program, the District shall award state graduation credit in physical education for participation in approved activities and elective courses.</u>
<u>ACTIVITIES AND COURSES</u>	<del><u>The District shall allow students to substitute certain physical activities for the required credits of physical education. Such substitution shall be based on the physical activity involved in the courses listed for this purpose in state rules. [See EIF(LEGAL)]</u></del>

<u>PRIVATE OR COMMERCIAL PROGRAMS</u>	<u>The District shall award state graduation credit in physical education for appropriate private or commercially sponsored physical activity programs conducted either on or off campus, upon approval by the Commissioner of Education. [See also EHAC]</u>
<u>NO OTHER PHYSICAL ACTIVITY PROGRAMS</u>	<del>The District shall not award state graduation credit for physical education for private or commercially sponsored physical activity programs conducted either on or off campus. [See also EHAC]</del>
TRANSFER STUDENTS	Transfer students shall be required to meet District requirements for graduation.

## PROPOSED REVISIONS

### COURSE REQUIREMENTS

#### GRADUATION PROGRAMS INSTITUTED PRIOR TO 2014–15

To graduate, a student must complete the courses required by the District in addition to those mandated by the state.  
Students enrolled in high school prior to the 2014–15 school year may graduate under state programs other than the foundation program, including the Minimum Program, the Recommended Program, and the Advanced/Distinguished Achievement Program. The courses required for each of these programs shall be listed in appropriate publications. The District credit requirements under these programs are listed below.

#### MINIMUM PROGRAM

For students who entered grade 9 prior to the 2012–13 school year, the District requires no additional credits for graduation under the Minimum Program beyond the number mandated by the state.

Beginning with students who entered grade 9 in the 2012–13 school year, the District requires completion of four credits in addition to the number required by the state for graduation under the Minimum Program.—for a total of 26 credits. The additional credits shall include one science credit, one mathematics credit, and two elective credits. The campus student support team shall determine whether waiving the four additional credit requirements is appropriate for the student. [See EIF (REGULATION)]

#### RECOMMENDED PROGRAM

For students who entered grade 9 prior to the 2012–13 school year, the District requires no additional credits for graduation under the Recommended Program beyond the number mandated by the state.

Beginning with students who entered grade 9 in the 2012–13 school year, the District requires completion of four credits in addition to the number required by the state for graduation under the Recommended Program.—for a total of 30 credits. The additional credits shall be electives.

#### ADVANCED / DISTINGUISHED ACHIEVEMENT PROGRAM

For students who entered grade 9 prior to the 2012–13 school year, the District requires no additional credits for graduation under the Advanced/Distinguished Achievement Program beyond the number mandated by the state.

Beginning with students who entered grade 9 in the 2012–13 school year, the District requires completion of four credits in addition to the number required by the state for graduation under the Advanced/Distinguished Achievement Program.—for a total of 30 credits. The additional credits shall be electives.

## ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT GRADUATION

### EIF (LOCAL)

#### MAGNET PROGRAM COURSE REQUIREMENTS

The District requires completion of additional credits beyond the number mandated by the state for graduation from the District's magnet program under the Advanced/Distinguished Achievement Program. The list of courses required for each of the magnet programs ~~may be found~~ shall be maintained in administrative regulations. [See EIF (REGULATION)]

#### READING CREDITS

The District shall offer up to 3 credits of reading for state graduation credit. The Superintendent or designee shall be responsible for establishing procedures to assess individual student needs and evaluate student progress and shall monitor instructional activities to ensure that student needs are met. Students shall be identified as eligible to earn reading credit based on:

1. Recommendation by a teacher or counselor.
2. Scores on assessment instruments and/or achievement tests.

#### FOUNDATION PROGRAM

The courses that satisfy District requirements under the foundation program, including courses for the distinguished level of achievement and courses for endorsements offered by the District, shall be listed in appropriate District publications.

#### WITHOUT AN ENDORSEMENT

The District requires completion of 4 credits in addition to the number required by the state for graduation under the foundation program without an endorsement. Graduation under the foundation program without an endorsement shall be permitted only as authorized under state law and rules.

#### WITH AN ENDORSEMENT

The District requires completion of 4 credits in addition to the number required by the state for graduation under the foundation program with an endorsement.

#### DISTINGUISHED LEVEL OF ACHIEVEMENT

The District shall not award state graduation credit in fine arts for participation in a community-based fine arts program.

#### NO FINE ARTS SUBSTITUTIONS

To the extent permitted by state rules applicable to the student's graduation program, the District shall award state graduation credit in physical education for participation in approved activities and elective courses.

The District shall allow students to substitute certain physical activities for the required credits of physical education. Such substitution shall be based on the physical activity involved in the courses listed for this purpose in state rules. [See EIF (LEGAL)]

# **HB 5 Credit Requirement**

**Parallel to current policy considering the 40 possible credits within a 4 year plan.**

- Foundation Plan (Minimum) = State 22 → District 26

(EIF Local) Beginning with students who entered grade 9 in the 2012–13 school year, the District requires completion of four credits in addition to the number required by the state for graduation under the Minimum Program, for a total of 26 credits.

(EIF Local) Beginning with students who entered grade 9 in the 2014–15 school year, **the District requires completion of four credits in addition to the number required by the state for graduation under the Foundation Plan for a total of 26 credits. The additional credits shall be electives.**

- Foundation + Endorsement Plan (Recommended) = State 26 → District 30

(EIF Local) Beginning with students who entered grade 9 in the 2012–13 school year, the District requires completion of four credits in addition to the number required by the state for graduation under the Recommended Program, for a total of 30 credits. The additional credits shall be electives.

(EIF Local) Beginning with students who entered grade 9 in the 2014–15 school year, **the District requires completion of four credits in addition to the number required by the state for graduation under the Foundation + Endorsement Plan, for a total of 30 credits. The additional credits shall be electives.**

# Performance Acknowledgements

- Student may earn a performance acknowledgement on their diploma and transcript for outstanding performance:
  - in a dual credit course
  - bilingualism and biliteracy
  - in an AP test or IB exam
  - in the PSAT, the ACT-Plan, the SAT, or the ACT
  - or earning a nationally or internationally recognized business industry certification or license.

# Off Campus Physical Education (OCPE)

- Chapter 74: Curriculum Requirements → §74.11. High School Graduation
  - In accordance with local district policy, a school district may award up to two credits for physical education for **appropriate private or commercially-sponsored physical activity programs conducted on or off campus**. The district must apply to the commissioner of education for approval of such programs, which may be substituted for state graduation credit in physical education. Such approval may be granted under the following conditions.
- Recommendation is to support Category Two**
- **CATEGORY TWO:** These programs are to be of high quality, well supervised by appropriately trained instructors, and consisting of a minimum of a minimum of Eight (8) hours per week. Students certified to participate at this level **MAY NOT** be dismissed from any part of the regular school day.

# **Off Campus Physical Education (OCPE)**

purpose of the program is to accommodate students who are making a serious effort to develop his/her capabilities and to allow them to be involved in an off campus program that provides training exceeding that offered in the school district.

**Campus physical activity programs will be approved for only those students who have been strongly recommended by qualified instructors.**

OCPE Program allows students in 9th through 12th grades to earn credits that meet the district and state education requirements. Students will be expected to show accountability of skill development related physical activity and health concepts and social development through participation in their selected activity and written and tested assignments that are based on the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Physical Education.

**Off-campus program will be allowed if located more than twenty (25) miles the district.**


