Mr. Erlebach shared the following:

- ✓ No Garibaldi Grade School Kindergarten students will enter the 1<sup>st</sup> grade in the red zone which is intensive intervention this year
- ✓ He has talked with both Ms. Nugent and Ms. Woika about covered play areas. He has looked at the structures at Nestucca Valley School District and at South Prairie Elementary school. The one at South Prairie has lighting. Mr. Erlebach explained that with the state increasing the requirement for PE minutes it will be important to have areas where children can get outside to play rather than coming into the gym and interrupting PE classes. He would like to get more information on the design and costs. The board encouraged him to move forward
- ✓ He asked the Board their opinion on full-day vs. half-day preschool. Mr. Kelly asked what Ms. Douma thinks about half-day/full-day preschool. Mr. Erlebach stated that she is not in favor of full-day. He stated that it could be paid for by the Preschool Promise grant. He has talked with Ms. Nugent and her staff and they are very excited about the possibility. Mr. Kelly asked him to get more data and schedule a work session. Ms. Aeder asked if he was contemplating this for next year. He stated that it would not be for next year.
- ✓ He attended the high school band competition in Corvallis and it was really great. The students were so excited. We are very fortunate to have Mr. Zaugg and Mr. Simpson
- ✓ We are finalizing the student/parent meal program surveys. They will go out next week
- ✓ Kinder Camp will be at Nehalem in August. We will not have Kinder Camp at Garibaldi
