Fine Arts Annual Report

Jackie Demontmollin provided the Board with highlights from the Fine Arts department over this past school year. Fine Arts established and led district wide Professional Learning Communities based in content area. Fine Arts Teachers participated in three District led Fine Arts PLC days that included norm development, goal setting, collaborative learning opportunity and team planning.

Head directors engaged in SMART Goal development sessions with their teams. 100% of secondary head directors submitted at least one SMART goal to work on during the course of the 2018-2019 academic year with their programs.

2017-2018 was spent visiting campuses and engaging a Fine Arts Council focus group to determine program needs to serve students. Following engagement in this process, we formed a long-term professional development engagement with which we expect to continue for a minimum of three years.
