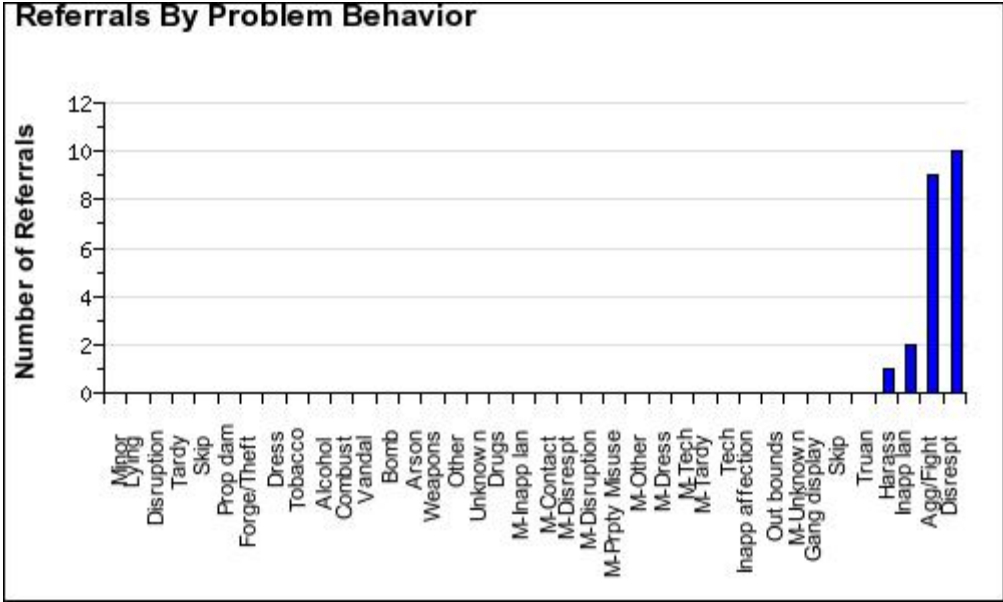
Our number of daily referrals has been below the national average.
There has been a decreasing trend since January.



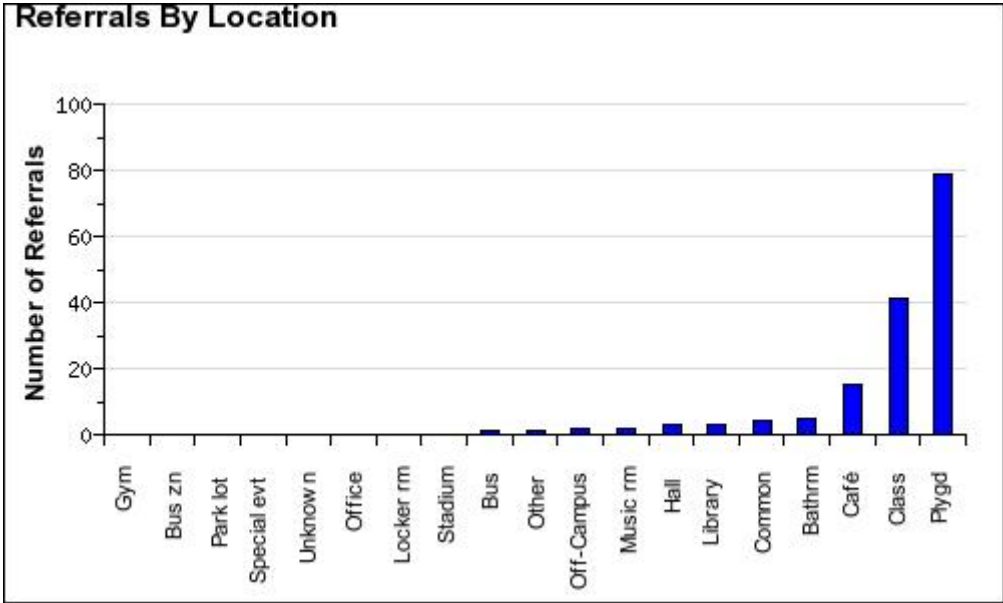
Data from the last two years reflects an escalation in referrals that occur between March and the end of the year.



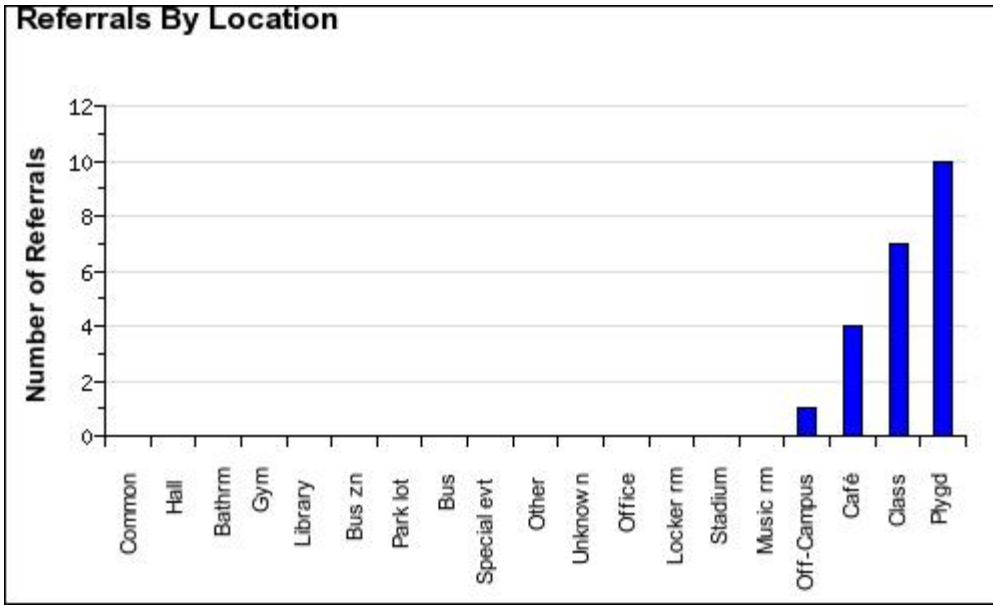
Aggressive behavior makes up 56% of our total referrals, and referrals for disrespect make up an additional 23% for the entire school year.



In April we see almost an equal number of referrals for defiance and fighting.

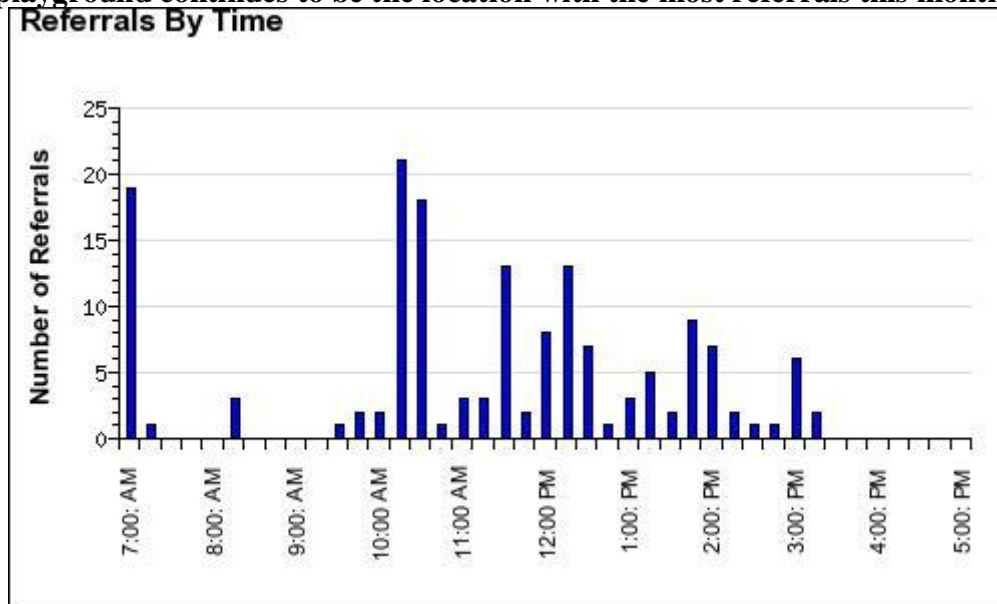


Over half of our total referrals are written on the playground (51%), and classroom referrals are our second highest location of occurrence (25%).

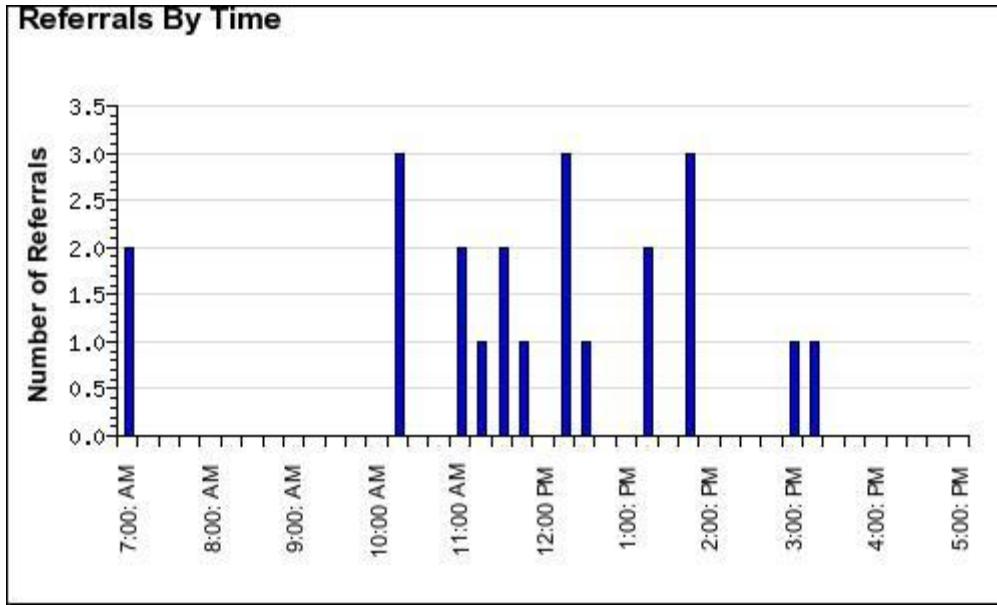

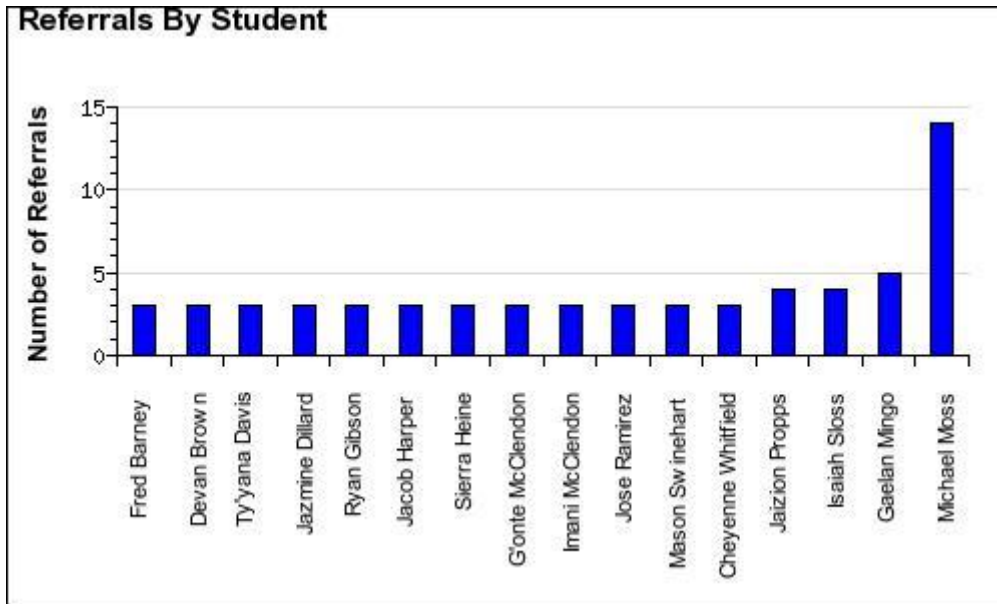
The playground continues to be the location with the most referrals this month.



We have experienced the highest number of referrals originating between 10:15am -10:45am (27 %) for the entire year.



Since March 29, the majority of our referrals are occurring during 1st and last recess, and at 12:15.



These are students with 3 or more referrals. Of the students operating in the yellow and red zones, 18% of the referrals have been received by one student.

According to the data, we are below the national average of referrals and could expect to see an increased number of referrals between now and the end of the year. Aggressive behavior is our number one reason for ODR's, and is occurring most frequently during our morning recess times.
