ABOUT US

ARVA is celebrating its 20th year of virtual education in Arkansas. Current enrollment is 4,117 in grades K-12 with students in each of Arkansas' seventy-five counties.

ARVA is currently working with the Department of Education to improve literacy. The plan currently in place utilizes evidence based curricula and practices and the SY23-34 plan includes increased reading instruction time for further expected gains.

Students at ARVA can take advantage of career and technical education opportunities in 20 pathways within 5 industry areas. Additionally, students can complete dual enrollment, obtain their Associate's Degree, participate in internships and earn credit through work based learning.



RECISSION OF ARK. CODE ANN. SECTION 6-17-2403, CONCERNING THE TEACHER COMPENSATION SCHEDULE

- Draft salary schedule is awaiting final board input and vote, but will prioritize experience at ARVA.
- Salaries have been raised over 16.5% in the last three years and will continue to include a teacher performance annual bonus ranging from a minimun of \$1,200 to \$3,500.

• Small, local learning centers, or "community pods" provide a physical space for learners but take advantage of a large range of quality resources to meet educational needs

INDIVIDUALIZED PATHWAYS

 Personalized pathways designed for each student based on their unique goals, interests, learning styles, and academic needs

DIVERSE COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

 Partnerships with local businesses, non-profits, and parent engagement groups provide expertise and mentorship opportunities

SCHOOL YEAR 23-24

- Sparkman, AR --existing students with potential interest expressed
- Currently 30 students enrolled/applied in grades K-12
- Up to 4 days of in person instruction, with Math and Literacy as a priority
- Parent/Community hosted location with parent/community provided transportation and lunch
- Team teacher approach, with in-person and online instructional model
- K-3 classroom, 4-6 classroom, and 7-12 classroom with rolling schedules for in-person and virtual instruction
