The Queen Elizabeth era was named for the Queen of the era, Queen Elizabeth I, of England. Some people do not realize the huge impact that her childhood made on her later days in her life. Another little known fact is that one of her nicknames, the virgin queen, contributed to reasons for not marrying. She was also very smart; especially in politics. Queen Elizabeth had a great impact on her realm, despite her rough life.

Elizabeth lived a very harsh life, particularly with her mother's death and other

family problems. Her father Henry VIII was a very masculine man whom loved gambling and women (White, 243). Henry wanted a son but got Elizabeth instead. By the time her mother conceived a boy, it was a still born and Henry was bored with her. He falsely accused her of incest and finally signed her death warrant. Henry sent Elizabeth

away because she reminded her father of his dead wife (Eakins, 5). She later had problems with her cousin, Mary, the Queen of Scots. Mary had a legitimate claim to the throne and Elizabeth knew she was a threat and killed her as soon as she had the chance

(Eakins, 4). One of Elizabeth's biggest internal conflicts occurred because she never got married. → Since you were talking about a lot of her external conflicts, you could have started the sentence with that to link it to her internal conflicts.

Queen Elizabeth had the nickname the virgin queen because she never married; even though she could "assume the presence of beauty even in her old age" (Picard

XX). Her closest brush with marriage came with Robert Dudley (britannica.com/paragraph#1). Historians believe she never married because of the way her father treated her mother (Eakins, XXI). Because she never got married and did not have to worry about a husband, she had lots of time to study.
