

Common Core Corner

Currently our students are working on writing informational/expository pieces of writing. Students have the opportunity to create different pieces of writing from books to reports on a topic they know a lot about or have researched. The following standards are examples of what is being asked of students at the different grade levels. If you would like to read more about the Common Core Standards, visit http://www.corestandards.org/.

Kindergarten—Use a combination of drawing, dictating, and writing to compose informative/explanatory texts in which they name what they are writing about and supply some information about the topic.

2nd Grade—Write informative/explanatory texts in which they introduce a topic, use facts and definitions to develop points, and provide a concluding statement or section.

4th Grade—Write informative/explanatory texts to examine a topic and convey ideas and information clearly.

Starting in 3rd grade, there are additional standards listed under this standard. An example of that is being able to introduce a topic and provide a concluding statement as well as developing the topic with facts, definitions and details.


Days/Times: Monday - Friday AM Session 8:15-11:15 PM Session 11:15-2:15
