Smoking in School Facilities

Substantial medical research has concluded that smoking will cause serious health problems. The Bristol Board of Education has recognized this concern by fostering a health curriculum and instructional program that instructs students about the health hazards of smoking and that seeks to persuade students not to smoke.

From both educational and health standpoints, it becomes the responsibility of all staff not only to instruct students about this health problem, but also to serve as role models regarding smoking.

Accordingly, there will be no smoking or use of vapor smoking devices in the Bristol Public School buildings and on the school grounds.
