- <u>Collaboration:</u> We strive to maintain an ongoing atmosphere of collaboration among grade levels and other support staff including ELL, SPED, and Title I. We do this by maintaining continuous conversations and professional development that support open dialogue.
- <u>Innovation:</u> As a Future Ready School we work with our Library Instructional Technology Teacher to plan professional development that is relevant and timely while at the same time supporting teachers and students with the necessary resources.

Efforts/Actions- Collaboration & Innovation

- <u>Collaboration</u>: Our school partnered with BEF and two elementary schools to offer a summer school program that involved 9 weeks of summer school opportunities between 3 elementary schools.
- <u>Innovation</u>: Bethany Elementary School is a Future Ready School site and is working with district office staff, teacher leaders, and key community members to implement instructional strategies that integrate technology into the delivery and assessment of instruction.

Goals- Our primary goal is to create a safe environment that is focused on significantly decreasing the achievement gap between subgroups.

Successes- Our school was recognized last year by "TheBestSchools.org" as one of the top 50 Elementary Schools in American Public Education.

District Goal: All students will show continuous progress toward their personal learning goals, developed in collaboration with teachers and parents, and will be prepared for post-secondary education and career success.

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Challenge- Our biggest challenge is making continual, steady, and linear progress toward closing the achievement gap between subgroups. While we have experienced many successes, we still see pockets of decreased performance from time to time.

Other

- Bethany Elementary is a Watch DOGS School
- Bethany Elementary has over 400 registered parent volunteers
- Bethany Elementary partnered with BEF and 2 other schools to create a 9-week summer school program.
- Bethany Elementary will phase in an After School Homework club in January that will have a special emphasis on supporting struggling students / and students who do not have Internet access at home.

Closing- We look forward to seeing the outcome of our work in delivering solid instructional strategies that will be integrated with new technology. I believe the influx of new technology in our building, combined with research based instructional strategies, will bring a new level of success to our students and community.
