WORDS FROM MRS. HUISH

To do well in school, you must have good attendance! When you miss school, you miss lectures, notes, class discussions, homework explanations, assignments, quizzes, and tests. It doesn't matter how good you are about making up your work, you can never make up everything you miss, even if you're out of school for only one day. In order to get good grades, you need to be in school every day.

If you must be absent from school, remember that you are responsible for finding out what you've missed and for getting all of the work made up. Of course, you are also responsible for arranging to make up any quizzes or tests that you've missed.

Since teachers usually don't have time to talk to students during class, see each teacher before or after class to find out what you've missed. Once you find out what you need to do, get everything made up as soon as possible.

If you know that you're going to miss school, tell your teachers ahead of time, and ask for assignments.

Parents:

The LBMS program emphasizes academics over athletics. If your student athlete is expected in after school Extended Learning Opportunity (ELO) or any other academic intervention, this takes strict precedence over their attendance to an athletic practice. Child Find for Special Education

Public Law 105.17, known as the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), requires that school districts provide a free and appropriate education to all disabled children and young adults from birth through 21 years of age. The Three Rivers School District requests assistance with the identification of any disabled children ages birth through 21 who are not enrolled or currently being served in one of the District's schools.

LBMS Winter Concert is scheduled for Tuesday, December 18 beginning at 7:00pm in the Viking gym.

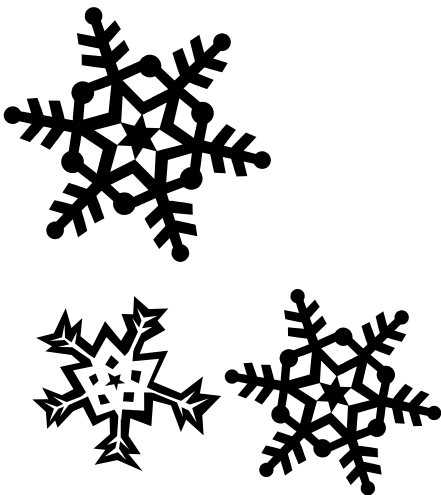
This program gives parents / guardians an opportunity to hear wonderful music performed by students.
