

Executive Summary: PRESS 121 First Reading

Introduction

PRESS, which stands for Policy Reference Education Subscription Service, is a policy service provided by the Illinois Association of School Boards (IASB). It provides school districts with an "encyclopedia" of sample board policies, administrative procedures, and exhibits. The board and district staff use these materials as a reference to help develop and update their own local policies.

Policies with Notable Changes

4:165 Awareness and Prevention of Child Sexual Abuse and Grooming Behaviors	Removes the requirement to provide parents/guardians of students in any of grades K through 8 with not less than five days' written notice before commencing any class or course providing instruction in recognizing and avoiding sexual abuse, as well as the opportunity to object in writing	Approve as presented
5:50 Drug- and Alcohol-Free Workplace; E-Cigarette, Tobacco, and Cannabis Prohibition	Adds a provision stating if an employee is on call they should not consume prohibited substances	Approve as presented
5:250 Leaves of Absence	In response to the Family Neonatal Intensive Care Leave Act, a provision has been added which allows employees to take a specified amount of unpaid leave if their child is a patient in a neonatal intensive care unit.	Approve as presented (Not PRESS Language)
5:330 Sick Days, Vacation, Holidays, and Leaves	Adds language about Election Day observance and the change in Policy 5:250 regarding NICU leave; updates paid holiday section to reflect current practice plus the	Approve as presented (Not PRESS Language)
