All licensure will remain the same as last year with the addition of the following:

- 528 (Computer Science 4-12)
- Approval Code: 5012 (Completed through Division of Career and Technical Education: DCTE office).

Approval Code will require **any licensed teacher** interested in adding the approval code to complete training provided by ADE: Division of Career Technical Education. This training will be conducted through virtual course work (6 hours) and at the pace of the licensed teacher. Upon completion of the virtual course work the Division of Career and Technical Education with the Office of Educator Effectiveness and Licensure will issue the approval code on the educator's license.
