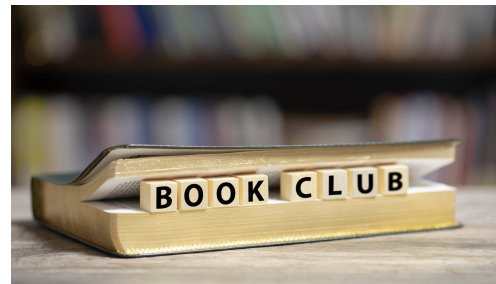

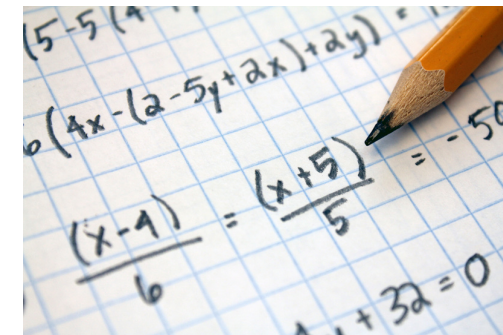

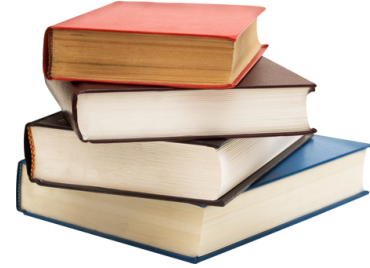
5th/6th Grade Reading Lab

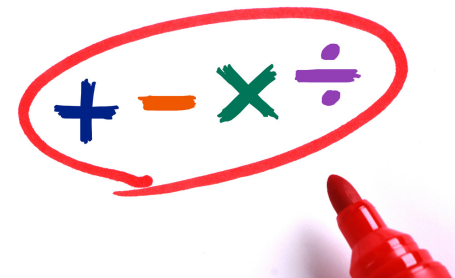
5th/6th Grade Math Lab

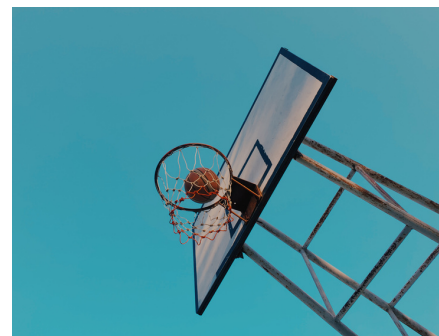

These are unprecedented or "strange times," and just as the world changes, theatre changes along with our learning process and reaction to the environment. Renowned American theatre academic, educator and acting coach, Viola Spolin is considered instrumental in the way directors look at theatre. She created techniques to help actors be focused in the present moment by using acting exercises that she later called "Theater Games." These focus on improvisation to react to what is going on in the immediate moment. This is a survey course for those with and without any stage experience during these stressful times, by using Spolin as a guiding force to activate the Creation, Development, and Rehearsal portion of our Anchor standards. The course is about process, not a final product, because art is ongoing.
