MN READ ACT UPDATES

Training: Phase 2 Teacher training delayed until 2026

Curriculum: MDE/CAREI continues to review elementary literacy curriculums, timeline delayed slightly

Intervention: MDE review of K-12 Interventions set to be provided to districts in Nov. 2025

Parent Notification: Regional Literacy Leads working to develop templates and exemplars as models for districts.

Screening: List of approved screening tools for 4-12 slated to be shared early 2025, still awaiting update

TRAINING

Elementary Progress

- Implemented a FastTrack option to allow teachers to learn and apply content more quickly
- 90% of current elementary and EC teaching staff will finish LETRS by the end of next school year

Secondary Progress

- 95% secondary special educators and EL teachers are trained in CAREIALL.
- Secondary Literacy Task Force is examining instructional best practice where implementing literacy strategies across the curriculum can impact learning for all students.

TRAINING-NEXT STEPS

K-12

- Required training for support staff scheduled for next school year
- Creation of plan to provide required training for new staff each year

Elementary

 Staff who have completed LETRS move to implementation of new learning in classrooms

Secondary

- Staff trained in summer 2024 CAREIALL training have participated in PLT continued learning and received resources and support toward implementation
- CAREIALL trained special educators will be trained on writing structured literacy based goals for students with identified reading disabilities

CURRICULUM

Elementary Progress

- Elementary Literacy Curriculum Review-In Progress
- 20+ staff including classroom, EL and SPED teachers and building and district administrators
- All grades and schools represented
- Reviewed U of M and MDE curriculum reports and rubrics
- Moving to Vendor Presentations
- Slated to identify pilot programs this spring

CURRICULUM

Secondary Progress

- Per MDE, there is no review of core curricula for grades 6-12; only intervention materials will be reviewed for grades 6-12.
- As a result, the Secondary ELA Program Review is focused on the following
 - Developing the ELA instructional vision including
 - Auditing current resources for elements of structured literacy

CURRICULUM-NEXT STEPS

Elementary

- Pilot resources in a wide variety of classrooms next year, including Spanish Immersion
- Make final recommendations on new curriculum Spring 2026
- Develop Implementation goals and plan Spring/Summer 2026

Secondary

After examining our current 6-12 resource, our ELA Program
Review team will make recommendations for secondary ELA
programming improvements and any necessary
supplementary materials that may be needed

- Principals reviewed fidelity and impact data January 2025

INTERVENTION

Elementary Progress

- Intervention Delivery and Progress Monitoring focus of district and building professional development for all literacy staff
- Training, planning and support provided to teachers to implement new practices and data collection
- Principals reviewed fidelity and impact data January 2025
- Allows teachers to have granular data to inform instructional decisions in real time

INTERVENTION

Secondary Progress

- Continue to place identified students in available Science of Reading courses
- Literacy Specialists will continue to suppor MS/HS SOR, RF3 and Special Education teachers with fidelity of Sonday intervention

INTERVENTION NEXT STEPS

Elementary

- Continue to build on momentum from this year
- Build regular opportunities to review data and plan interventions into the school year PD calendar
- Review MDE approved interventions and determine whether changes to intervention resources are recommended

Secondary

Waiting on approved K-12 interventions.

PARENT NOTIFICATION

K-12 Progress

- Staying connected to updates from Regional Literacy Leads on progress
- Notifying parents when students receive specialized reading services

PARENT NOTIFICATION-NEXT STEPS

K-12

- Review templates and exemplars and modify to meet the needs of 742 families
- Develop a streamlined communication plan

SCREENING

Elementary Progress

- Second year of using MDE approved screener, FastBridge
- Built capacity with staff to understand data and develop instructional actions to respond
- Gathering teacher feedback to potentially modify screening based on guidance from MDE

Secondary

 Continue to use the dyslexia screening process as outlined in our Local Literacy Plan

SCREENING-NEXT STEPS

Elementary Progress

 Begin using MDE Risk Factor tool to support decision making related to reading services

Secondary Progress

Waiting on MDE to release approved 4-12 screening tools
