Subject: Consider Approval of Resolution Recognizing Denton County 4-H Organization as an Extracurricular Status and Approve the Adjunct Faculty Agreement

Background Information:

- TEA rules allow for a student who is not actually on campus at the time attendance is taken to be considered "in attendance" for funding purposes if the student is participating in an activity that is approved by the local board of trustees and under the direction of a member of the professional staff of the school district, or an adjunct staff member who (A) has a minimum of a bachelor's degree; and (B) is eligible for participation in the Teacher Retirement System of Texas, 19 Texas Administrative Code Section 129.21(j)(1)
- Staff is requesting that the Board of Trustees approve student participation in the Denton County Texas 4-H Organization as an LISD extracurricular activity and appoint Texas A&M AgriLife County Extension Agents as adjunct LISD faculty members.
- This agreement requires approval on a yearly basis. This is the 10th year this resolution has come forward for approval.

Administrative Consideration:

- The Denton County Texas 4-H Organization is approved for recognition and eligible for extracurricular status consideration under 19 Texas Administrative Code Chapter 76.1, pertaining to extracurricular activities.
- The recommended action provides for the appointment of Texas A&M AgriLife County Extension agents named in the Agreement as adjunct faculty members of LISD at no expense to LISD.
- District students participating in the extracurricular activities discussed herein may be counted as "in attendance" for Foundation School Purposes.
- Participation by students under provisions of this resolution is subject to all rules and regulations set forth under the 19 Texas Administrative Code as interpreted by this Board of Trustees and designated officials of the District whose rules shall be final.
- Before any of the adjunct personnel listed can provide services at any LISD schools they will have to work with CTE to obtain appropriate background checks and clearance.

 By approving this agreement, it allows the Denton County Agriculture extension service to provide assistance to elementary and middle schools for the teaching of topics specific to agriculture and animal sciences.

Recommendations:

• That the Lewisville ISD Board of Trustees approve the Resolution Regarding Denton County Extracurricular Status of 4-H Organization and the Adjunct Faculty Agreement with Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service.
