Spring has arrived and with it the growth of new plants and old. This gives us an opportunity to grow something together as a family. Everyone has enough space to plant something. It can be outside or inside in a pot. When we plant something it provides many teachable moments. These are the top ten teachable moments of planting.

- 1. Have your child be responsible for the plant and take care of it.
- 2. Talk to your child about what a plant needs to survive.
- 3. If you plant something that is edible, talk about how many of our foods come from plants.
- Patience! Since plants can take many days to grow it can be great for your child to have to wait for the plant to sprout. (Measure daily to see the change)
- 5. The affects of over abundance. (Too much water or sun)
- 6. Photosynthesis.
- 7. The differences of plants (plant two or more plants and compare the differences.)
- 8. The symbiotic relationship that we share with plants.
- 9. Plants are alive. (The life cycle of a plant.)
- 10. It is a fun family activity that you can do together.

So, go out and plant something!
