Class 5A All-State Volleyball Team Recognition by the Texas Girls Coaches Association

The Texas Girls Coaches Association named Central High School's Caylin Mahoney to its Class 5A All-State Volleyball Team. The junior setter is the first Central volleyball player to receive the honor. In 41 matches last season, Mahoney averaged 10.6 assists, 2.7 kills and 3.45 digs per game. In addition to being named All-State, Mahoney was recognized as an All-Area Player by the *Fort Worth Star-Telegram* and the *Dallas Morning News*. Mahoney helped Central capture the 2009 District 5-5A championship with a perfect 14-0 record in district play. The TGCA All-State Volleyball team was named last fall and included the top 30 athletes in each University Interscholastic League classification.

Title I, Part A Distinguished Performance Awards by the TEA's NCLB Division

North Riverside Elementary School (Robyn Gibson, Principal) and Parkview Elementary School (Doreen Krebs, Principal) both received the Title I, Part A Distinguished Performance Award for the 2009-10 school year by the Division of No Child Left Behind Program Coordination at the Texas Education Agency. This prestigious designation recognizes schools that have consistently demonstrated strong academic performances over a three-year period. These Title I, Part A schools achieved the Academically Exemplary rating for the present school year and have a residing population of 40% or more low income students, as reported on NCLB Consolidated Application for Federal Funding. The primary function of NCLB is to close the achievement gap between groups of students by requiring greater accountability and offering increased flexibility and choice.

Texas All-State Musicians Recognition by the Texas Music Educators Association

In January, Keller ISD high school choir and band members competed in the final round of the Texas Music Educators Association's All-State auditions in Abilene. While 55,000 students initially entered the All-State competitive process in September, only one-half of one percent actually receives the prestigious honor of being named as a Texas All-State Musician.

Travis Threlkeld, Chrystle Hicks, Patricia Krecklow and alternate Kinsey Moline are the Central High School Choir students who earned a place in the Texas All-State Choir. They are under the direction of Leigh Ann McClure.

Taylor Barnes, Kelsey Harper, Sterling Kohout, Diana Mabie, and Stephanie Peterson are the Keller High Choir students who earned a place in the Texas All-State Choir. They are under the direction of Chi King.

Laurel Roseborrough and Andrew Gallop are the Keller High School Band students who earned a place with the Texas All-State Band and Orchestra.

All-State performances were held as part of the annual TMEA Convention, the nation's largest music educator's convention, earlier this month. Over 24,000 people from Texas and beyond attended over 290 workshops, 65 concerts and visited over 1,000 exhibit booths.
