Board Goal 3

Increase the percentage of students graduating CCMR-ready from 80% (August 2025) to 90% (June 2030).

CCMR's Moving Targets

While the Class of 2025 achieved a 96% CCMR rate, state-level changes to how CCMR is calculated require a reset of our baseline.



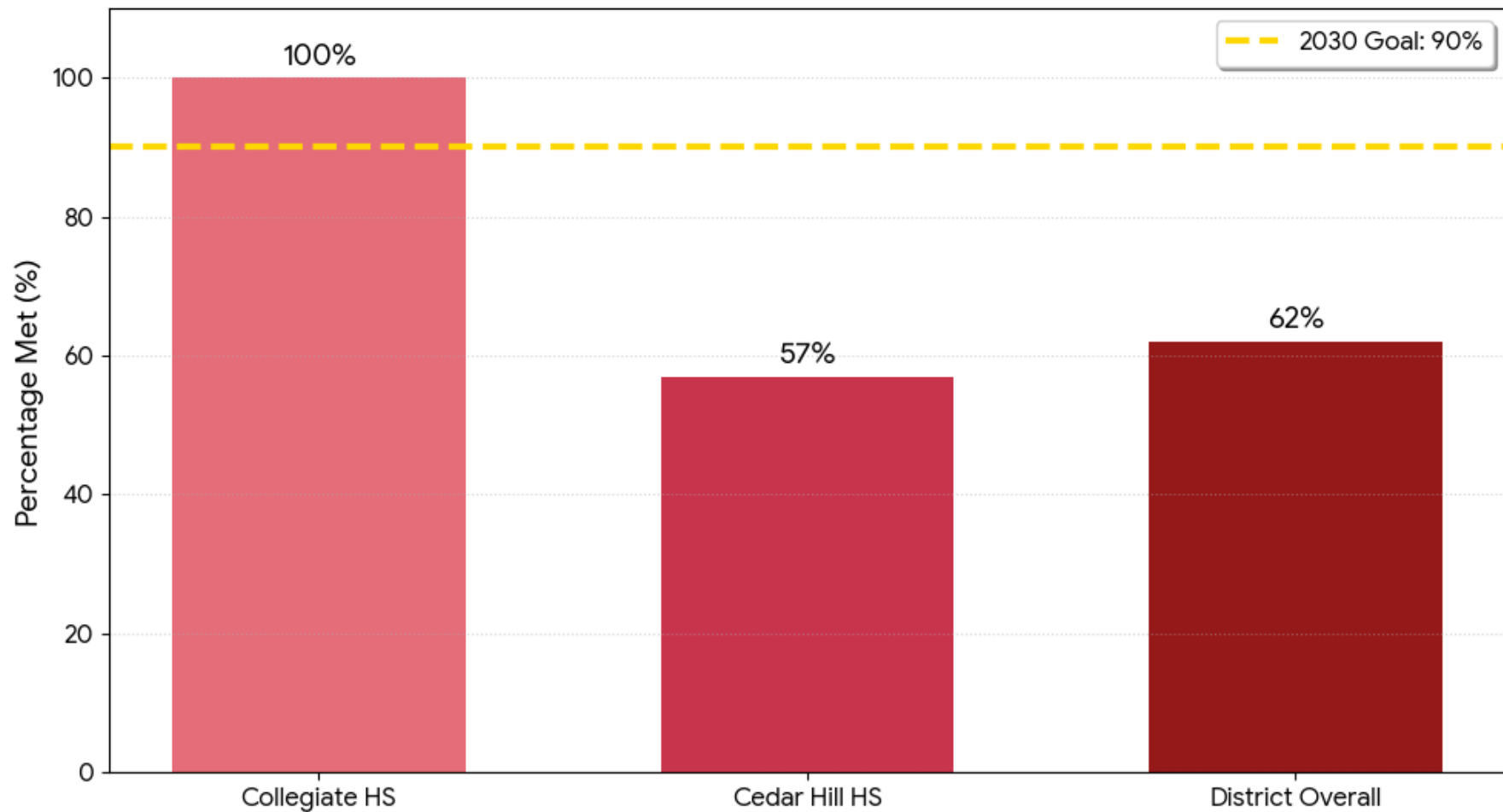
Board Goal 3 Progress Measures

Goal progress measures ensure every scholar has a post-secondary credential or college-ready status before walking the stage.

- Targeting early TSI readiness in 11th and 12th grades.
- Aligning Industry-Based Certifications (IBCs) with high-value career pathways
- Tracking and monitoring all other CCMR indicators

Texas Success Initiative (TSI) Met By Assessment

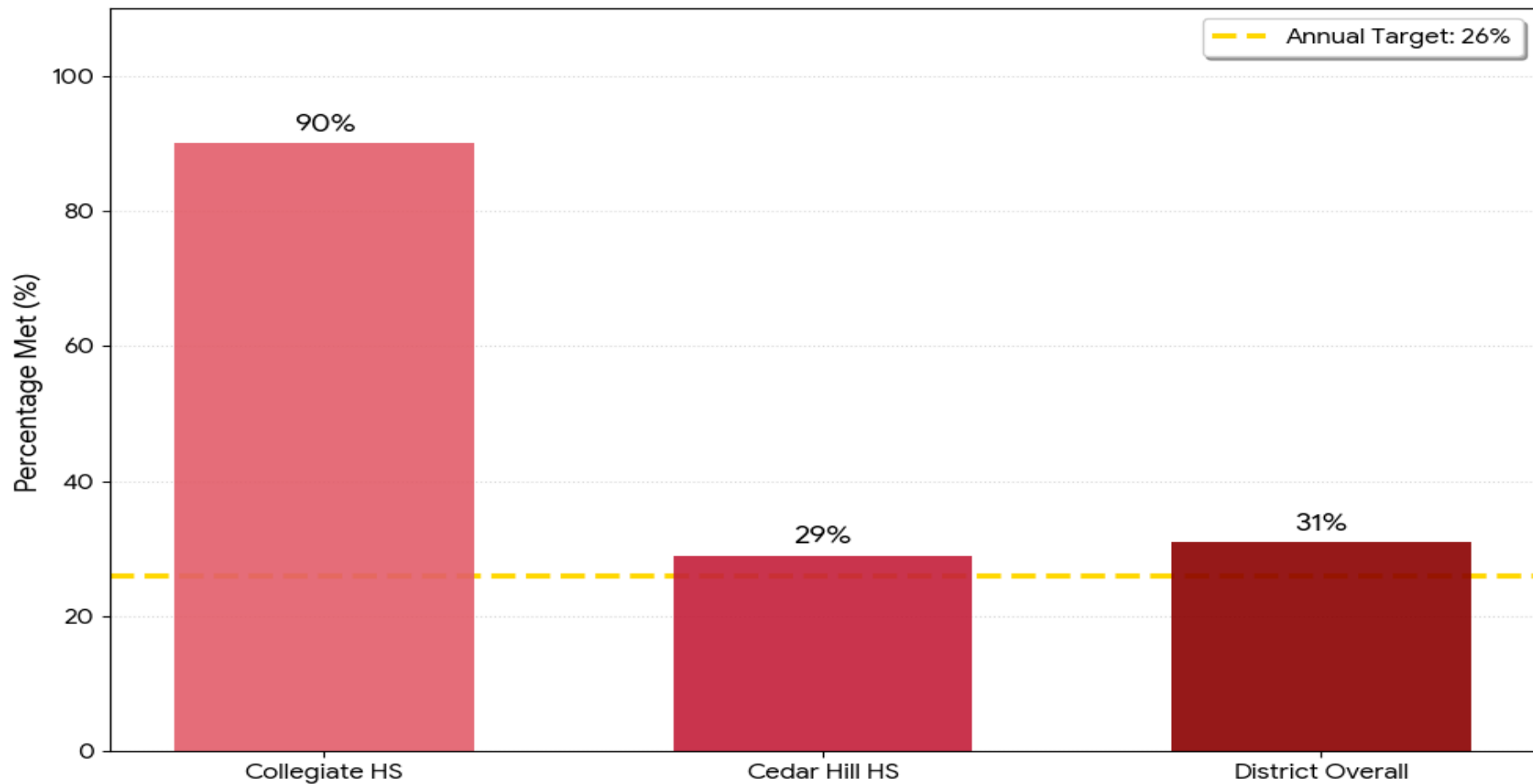
- **Requirement:** Scholars must meet benchmarks in **both** ELAR and Math to count as College Ready.
- **Current Metrics (2025-26 Standards):**
 1. **TSIA2:** ELAR (945+ and Essay 5+)

Math (950+)

1. **SAT:** ELAR (480) | Math (530).
2. **ACT:** English+Reading (40) | Math (22)



Class of 2026 Seniors: Met by Assessment (TSI)





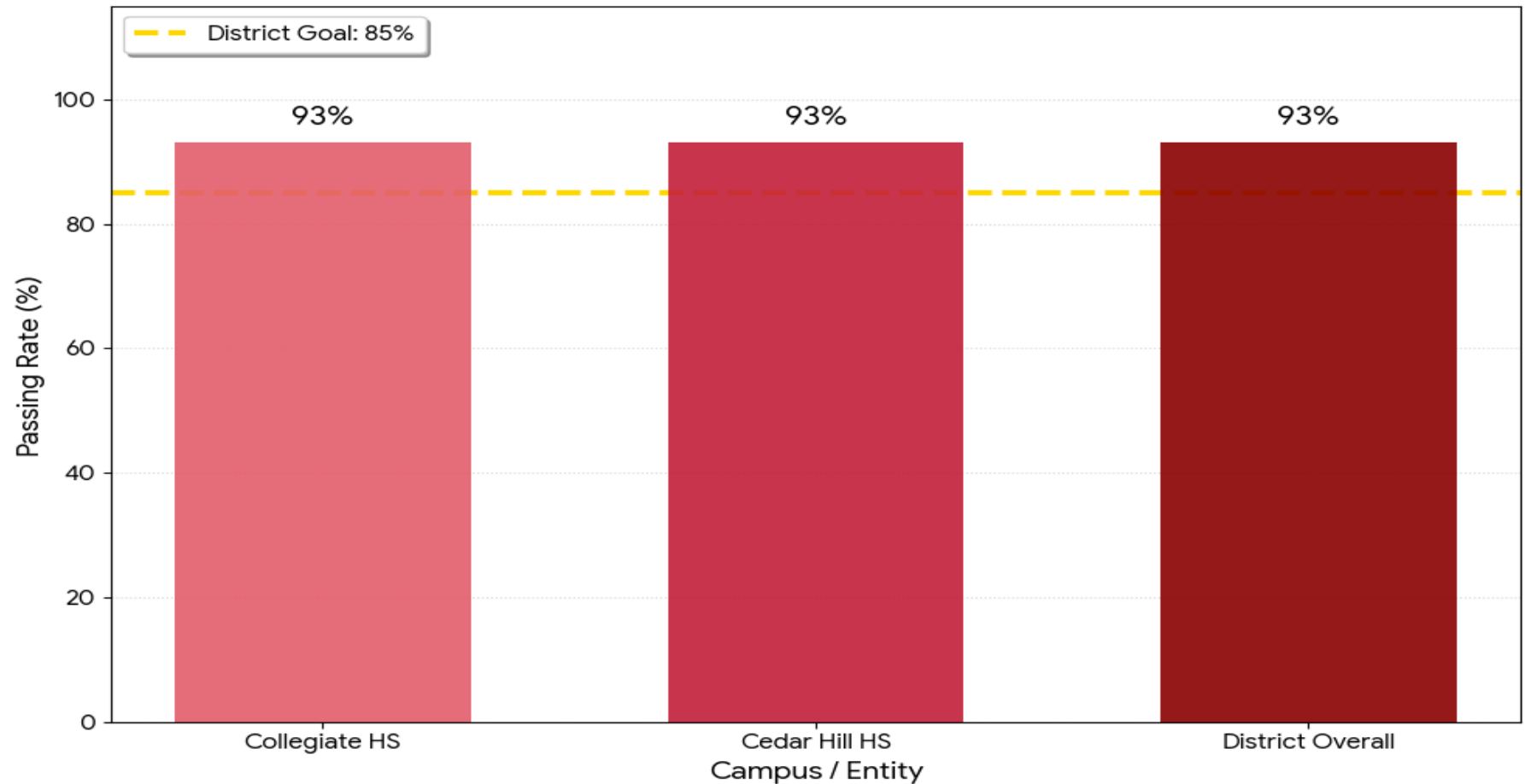
Goal Progress Measure 3.2

IBC & Career Pathways

- **The New Standard:** It is no longer enough to just pass a certification exam.
- **Alignment Requirement:** For the Class of 2026, CCMR credit requires:
 1. Earning an Approved IBC (from the new v3/v4 list)
 2. Being a CTE Completer, including at least one Level 3 or 4 course in an aligned program of study
- 2025-2026 data will be presented in the Spring of 2026

Dual Credits Earned Fall 2025

- **Exceeding Benchmarks:** Maintaining a 93% pass rate ensures that the vast majority of scholars enrolled in these programs are automatically earning CCMR credit, regardless of changes to TSI or IBC testing rules.
- **Equity in Performance:** The identical 93% success rate across both Collegiate High School and Cedar Hill High School demonstrates that high academic standards and support systems are being applied consistently across the District.
- **Goal Alignment:** These high pass rates directly support Board Goal 3 by offsetting the loss of points that may occur as the state increases the rigor in other areas



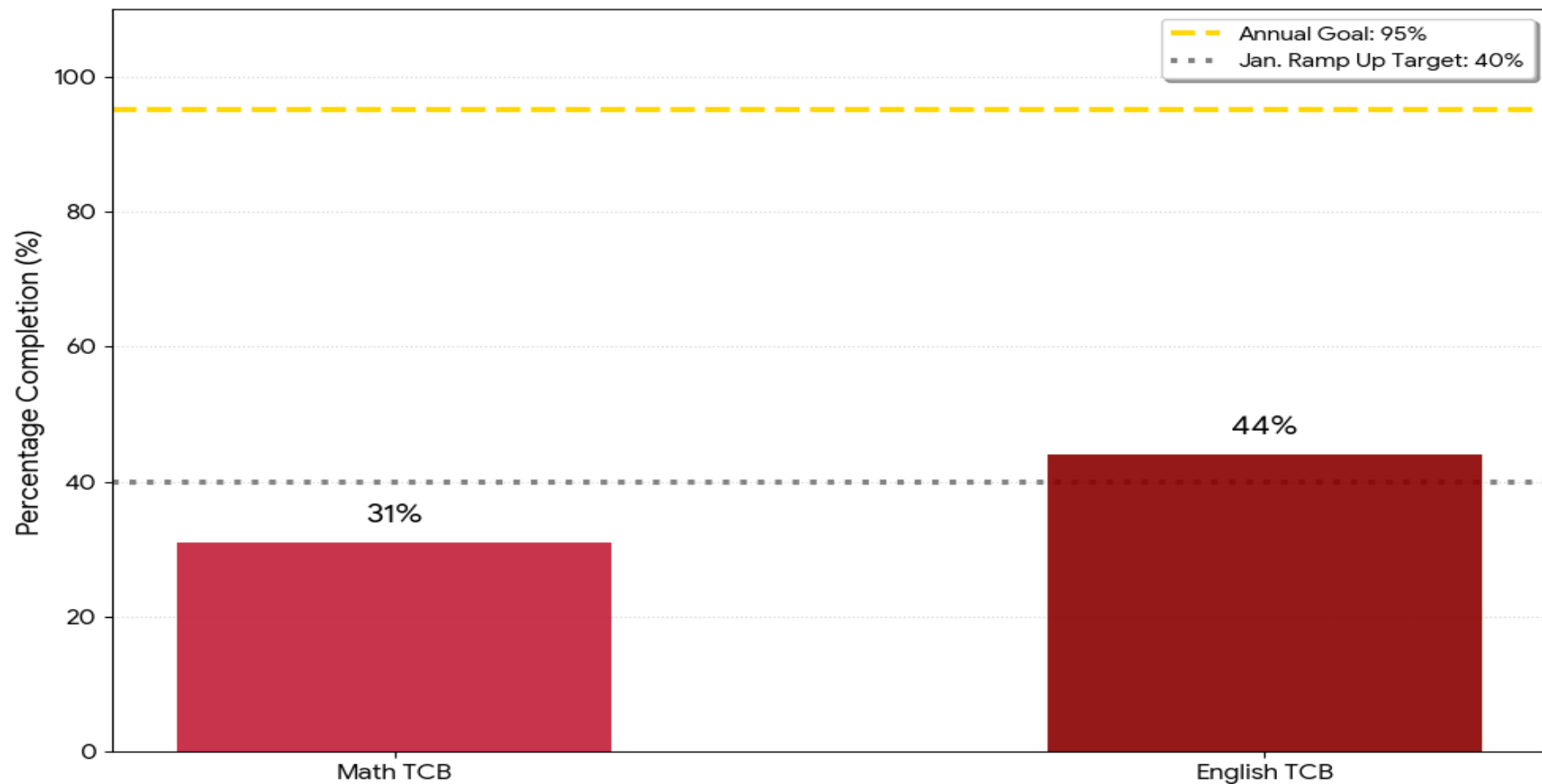
Sunsetting Texas College Bridge



- **Class of 2026 TCB:** We are currently pushing the Class of 2026 to finish any remaining TCB work this year while it still carries weight for their graduation year, while simultaneously ramping up Texas Success Initiative Assessment 2 (TSIA2) testing.
