Equity Summit Initiative

Purpose

The communities of Oak Park and River Forest have many organizations, commissions, and committees that have been formed to address the challenge of creating an equitable community. SAY is hosting a professionally facilitated gathering of community organizations who are working toward equity, specifically for youth, in the communities of OP and RF with the goal of:

- Having these group be informed of each other's goals and work
- Mapping out an overall community-based equity approach that incorporates our various initiatives in order to determine what may be missing and where there are opportunities for collaboration
- Providing the first step toward strategizing on ways to galvanize support when needed

Scope

- Community efforts focused on securing equitable experiences, services, and outcomes for children/youth of Oak Park and River Forest, ages 0-22. The first meeting of the Summit will not be focused on school or school district led initiatives.

Proposed Approach

An Equity Summit will be held December 4, 2016 and will be facilitated by the Morten Group. A pre-Summit survey was sent to collect basic information about each group focusing on the mission/purpose, their specific initiatives/activities, what they are expecting to change, and how they will know the change is taking place. The facilitated meeting will be a working meeting to achieve the goals stated above. Subsequent actions or steps will be determined by the attendees.

- Meeting scheduling and management (facilitation and notes)
- Collecting, packaging and providing organizational info for the meeting
- Meeting follow-up notes, information, and support of subsequent actions
