Math- Marissa Cabrales

The math classes have given the first unit benchmark tests. They have also been reviewing objectives from the previous year that are needed for this year's course.

We have several students signed up for the PSAT and PLAN tests. They will be administered on Oct 9^{th} and Oct 16^{th} .

Also, the teachers have divided up a group of students needing tutorials for TAKS and EOC retests. They will be working with these students at least once a week.

Volleyball-Coach Deaver

The Lady Chap Volleyball teams have started district play. This is a great group of hard working young ladies. They have a joyful attitude, and they are learning many life lessons through the sport. It's an honor and privilege to be associated with these girls, their parents, and this coaching staff.

Science- Penny Wimbrough

Physics: We are currently finishing our unit on 1 dimensional motion. The students have done a series of labs using motion detectors, spark timers and lab pros.

Pre-AP physics: The students just completed a 'problem-based' learning activity in which they assumed the role of insurance agents. From clues they were given about a car accident, they had to decide who was at fault using kinematic equations.

Biology: We are currently looking at the structure of organic molecules and are building paper models of their structure.

Pre-AP Biology: We are currently studying the action of enzymes and will be doing a lab that investigates the effects of the enzyme amylase (found in saliva) on starch molecules.

AP Biology: We are working on our evolution unit and they are preparing to present about a part of population evolution using power points.

Medical Microbiology: They have selected and cultured their unknown and they are beginning a unit where they will become proficient at isolation streaking and gram staining so they can identify their unknown.

Environmental Science: The students are studying the different levels of ecological organization. They are working in groups to design a poster that accurately describes the characteristics of different biomes.

Biology: Students are working to understand the different types of macromolecules using paper organic molecule models.

Chemistry: The chemistry group is currently learning chemical bonding, covering periodic trend, electron configuration and bonding. The students have just completed a chemical bonding lab where they observed the properties of ionic, covalent and metallic bonds.

Pre-AP Chemistry: The Pre-AP chemistry group is currently studying chemical bonding, covering periodic trend, electron configuration and bonding. The students have just completed a chemical bonding lab where they identified ionic, covalent and metallic bonds based on observed properties such as conductivity and solubility.
