Over the 2011-2012 season, Vicksburg Community Schools made significant advances in fulfilling the mission and charge of its Performing Arts Center to serve our students and the community. Here are some highlights:

- Sustained growth in participation in, and audiences, continues to be seen in our extra-curricular musical theatre program. Once again, opportunities to participate in productions were offered to the 4<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> grades and the 9<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grades. In November, audiences' spirits soared with excitement as the PAC presented the classic musical family favorite – **Annie, Jr.** Audiences also saw the high school students in **Stage Door** and **The Scarlet Pimpernel**.
- The PAC was ready and able to serve the needs of all of the community organizations that present the annual favorites including **Main Street Revue** visiting *The Pink Flamingo Trailer Park*, the **59<sup>th</sup> Annual Vicksburg Rotary Showboat**, and the **South County Players** performing *Beauty and the Beast*.
- In order to keep pace with the demands on our equipment and technology, the process of studying feasibility of undertaking, and researching applicable solutions to, needed upgrades to our sound system, lighting system and ticketing software, were begun.
