## Summary of Beaverton School District Preschool Programs (2017-2018 school year)

There are currently three types of preschool programs operating within Beaverton School District (BSD) school buildings: 1) District pre-k programs, 2) Head Start pre-k programs, 3) Career Technical Education (CTE) pre-k programs. This report provides a brief overview of each type of program.

District funding for preschool programming (general fund & Title I): \$533,075 paying for two preschool teachers, three IAs, and two CTE teachers.

Total number of children served in district funded pre-k: 147

Total number of children served in co-located Head Start classrooms: 115

Total number of pre-k children served in BSD schools: 262

**District pre-k programs.** Aloha Huber Park K-8 School and Vose Elementary School are both operating district pre-k programs. All children served in these programs are from the school's catchment area and qualify for free and reduced lunch.

- Aloha Huber Park K-8 School operates a one-half day morning session of pre-k.
  - Funding source: Title I
  - o Children served: 20
- Vose Elementary School operates two half day sessions of pre-k, one in the morning and one in the afternoon.
  - Funding Source: Title I and district general fund.
  - o Children served: 38
- Bonny Slope will begin offering two half day sessions of pre-k, one in the morning and one in the afternoon. Opening 2/5/17.
  - Funding source: Early Childhood Special Education and district general fund.
  - Children served: Up to 40 (estimate)

Head Start pre-k programs. Washington County Head Start currently operates classrooms in three BSD schools – Barnes Elementary School, William Walker Elementary School, and Conestoga Middle School. Per district agreement, Head Start must make every effort to enroll children in the program from the school's catchment area, and when unable to do that, may reach out to students who will attend kindergarten at nearby BSD schools. All program expenses, including transportation and classroom materials, are funded by Head Start, with classroom space provided in-kind by BSD. Each site runs two half day sessions a day. Enrollment is as follows:

- William Walker Elementary: 38 students enrolled (20 morning, 18 afternoon) from the following BSD feeder patterns:

  - o Raleigh Park Elementary: 1 student
  - o Rock Creek Elementary: 1 student

**CTE pre-k programs.** Beaverton operates two preschools connected to high school CTE programs: Little Wildcats at Westview High School and Little Warriors at Aloha High School. These classrooms function as training classrooms for high school students enrolled in the child development CTE program at both high schools. These programs are funded through district general fund and tuition.
