Curriculum & Instruction

On October 12, Craig High School administered the PSAT to 15 students. The PSAT is used to identify National Merit Scholars, and it also provides a study focus for the SAT.

Students have been taking their MAP fall benchmark during the month of October. The results are promising, with many students showing high growth, high achievement, or both. Staff will be analyzing the benchmark data and reports to provide targeted interventions in reading and math.

Nicole Nelson's Biology classes were given the opportunity to dissect and take samples of a recently killed female wolf. The biology classes, along with the help of Ellen Hannan, are collecting skin, muscle, and foreleg bone samples to send to the Alaska Department of Fish and Game. They will also be looking at the internal anatomy. If intact, they will collect the female reproductive tract to see if there is scarring present, which would indicate that she has given birth to a litter at some point.

Activities and Events

CHS will be sending three musicians to the Region V Southeast Alaska Honor Choir and Honor Band. Congratulations to Sierra Nelson, Manami Lehman, and Daniel Aspery.

Cross-country runners had a great showing at the state competition where they placed third. Rogan Hanson placed in the top 10.

Swimmers travelled to Juneau last week where the Lady Panthers broke four school records, and the men broke two. The team finished 4th the first day and 3rd the second day. On October 29, they will head to Ketchikan for the regional competition.

Volleyball went to the Jive Tournament in Juneau October 15, travel to Metlakatla October 21, and have home games against Petersburg October 29. Currently, they are 2-1 in league play.
