Description: The presentation will provide an overview of the district's performance in the 2023 Texas Education Agency (TEA) Accountability Ratings, released in April. The Division of Academics has conducted a comprehensive analysis of the results, highlighting key areas for improvement and identifying strategic priorities. In response to these findings, the district is implementing targeted, data-driven initiatives aimed at accelerating academic achievement and fostering sustained progress across all campuses.

Historical Data: TEA released the 2023 A–F accountability ratings in April 2025, following a two-year delay due to legal challenges from over 120 school districts. These ratings assess school and district performance based on standardized test scores, college readiness, and efforts to close achievement gaps.
