**KHS** students earn top results on nationwide German exam: Three Keller High students – Greg Golden, Kevin Golden and Kerry Childs – have been ranked above the 85<sup>th</sup> percentile on the American Association of Teachers of German National Examination Level 3. Greg Golden achieved a spot in the 95<sup>th</sup> percentile, which enters him in a drawing for an all-expenses paid trip to Germany. These students took the exam in January.

**Keller ISD students walk their way to victory:** Second-graders at Park Glen Elementary have won the United Way-Northeast's "Get Up and Go!" project for Keller ISD. Their award is based on the amount of second-grade participation in the program, which encourages physical activity and "bonding time" for local schoolchildren and the important adults in their lives. In addition, the department won six gold star awards, four silver star awards and one best of category.
