Why the Common Core?

These common standards help ensure that students are receiving a high quality, rigorous education consistently, from school to school and state to state. The Common Core State Standards are shared learning expectations adopted by 46 states around the country. They provide a clear, consistent understanding of what our students are expected to learn in K-12 math and English.

The Common Core are not federal standards. They were developed by the states for the states. Teachers, administrators, parents, and educational experts from across the country came together to design these common standards for what our students need to know and be able to do to be prepared for their futures. The state-led effort received feedback from a wide range of national organizations, educators, and over 10,000 stakeholders from around the country.

We own this. Our state has been involved in every step of the standard's development and adoption. Oregon teachers and administrators reviewed various versions of the standards and provided multiple rounds of feedback to the Common Core developers before they was adopted by the State Board of Education. Oregon has been very active in helping to shape this work to make sure it meets the needs of our students and schools.

Our kids need to be prepared for college, career, and future success. Because they are aligned to international standards, the Common Core will prepare our students to compete not only with students from around the country but with students from around the world. As the economy continues to globalize, we need to ensure that all students, no matter where they live, are prepared for the opportunities and challenges they will face after high school.

What students learn in school should be directly related to the skills they will need once they leave. The Common Core places a strong emphasis on reading informational texts to prepare students for what they will be asked to do in college and the work-place. These standards will prepare our students for career success in the rapidly changing world of work. However, students will still study literary texts.

The Common Core are not curriculum. Curriculum is what and how students are taught and curriculum remain a local school district decision. The Common Core are simply the standards outlining what students should know and be able to do at various grades. Oregon has had state-adopted standards for years with locally adopted curriculum that allows for teacher flexibility and creativity in the class-room. The Common Core are simply the latest version of these standards.

During tough economic times, we need to utilize economies of scale. Common standards mean that resources and materials can be shared across states. It also means that teachers can share strategies, lesson plans, and best practices to better meet the needs of their students. This can save states money and improve instruction for kids.

Spanish at North Valley and the College Entrance Requirement

Students who plan on attending an **Oregon university** must demonstrate proficiency in a second language by completing two years of the same language in high school with a grade of C- or better, or P (pass).

For North Valley students this means that your child must complete **four trimesters** (2 credits) of Spanish:

Spanish 1A Spanish 1B

FROM THE LIBRARY

Welcome to North Valley High School for 2013-2014

Some basic information for you:

There is **NO** food or drink allowed in the Library, water with a lid is allowed.

Do not bring food or liquid in to the computer labs; water must stay in your backpack, never near the computers.

Students are allowed to check out up to 4 books **if** you are responsible. The check-out period is for 2 weeks but you can renew for longer if there is no one waiting on the book.

Magazines are checked out for 1 week at a time but they may be renewed too.

There are overdue fees of .05 per day until the book or magazine is returned or the fine reaches \$5.00. I do not need the book to renew your checkouts. Just stop by my desk and we can make sure to keep your account free of fines.

You can use the computer to check for books in your library. After you log in go to the Destiny program and search. If you do not see what you need please ask and I will do my best to help you. There are many links there for extra resources.

We have a shelf of obsolete books in the Library that are free for you to take. These books are next to the wooden bin that is the **Lost and Found**. There are shelves of free magazines also.

This year the Library will sell tag board (24"x36") for 35 cents per sheet.

The computer lab in the library is open at 7:30 and closes at 4pm, please check with the librarian to make sure that someone will be there if you need to use the lab before or after school.

There is a shelf of games in the library for students to use at free times.
