



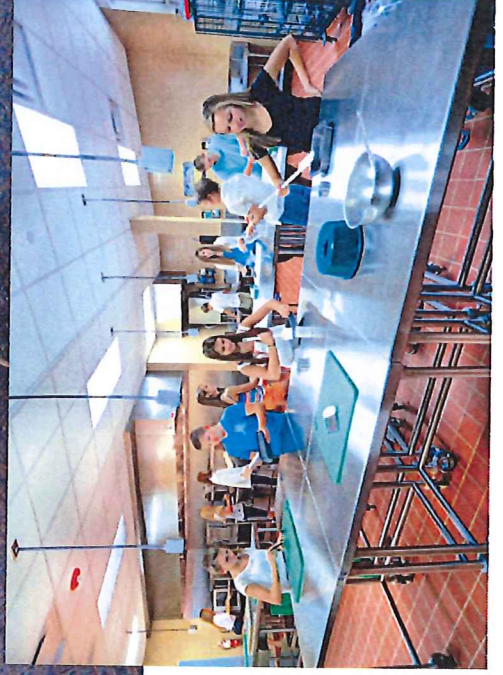
Intermediate District 287 - South Education Center Richfield, Minnesota



Opened in 2008, the South Education Center (SEC) offers ten unique academic programs to meet the needs of its member districts most challenging students. The SEC includes an Alternative education high-school program for 160 students, ages 12 through 21, and babies of enrolled students. Work-based alternative program for grades 9 through 12, attend four hours and then go to work sites; Program for pregnant and parenting students in grades 7 through 12 attend childcare classes.

Intermediate District 287 - North Education Center New Hope, Minnesota

Opened in 2012, the North Education Center (NEC) houses 250 staff members and 450 students offering an array of programs including: Area Learning Center; Daycare for infants and toddlers; Career and Technical or C-Train which offers classes such as Culinary Arts, Certified Nursing Assistant, Food Service Assistant; and structured settings for students with disabilities.



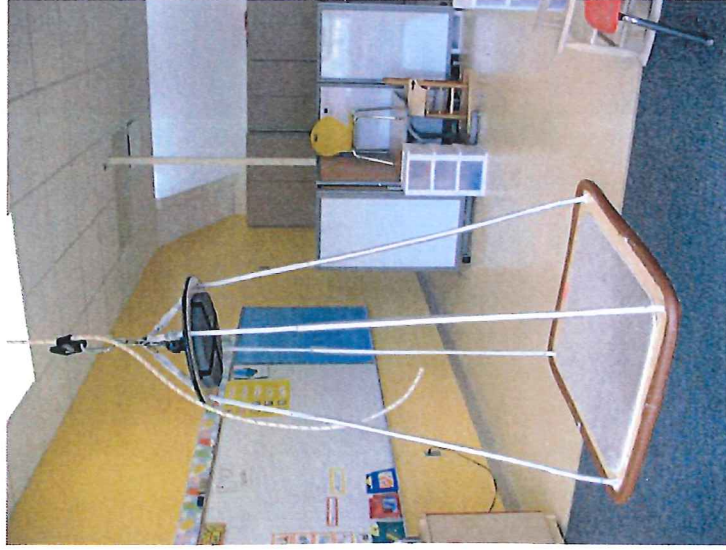
Intermediate District 287 – West Education Center *(former Bren Road Tech Center)* Minnetonka, Minnesota



The West Education Center is an adaptive reuse of an existing building as an alternative high school. The 62,000 square foot facility includes general classrooms, classrooms for science, wood-working, art/ceramics, pre-vocational sessions and a computer lab. In addition to classrooms, the building contains staff offices, social worker offices, a multi-purpose room, a student canteen and break room, serving kitchen, and a dining room. The site houses several specialized transition programs for students in Grades 9-12.



Wayzata Public Schools – Oakwood Elementary Special Education Addition Plymouth, Minnesota

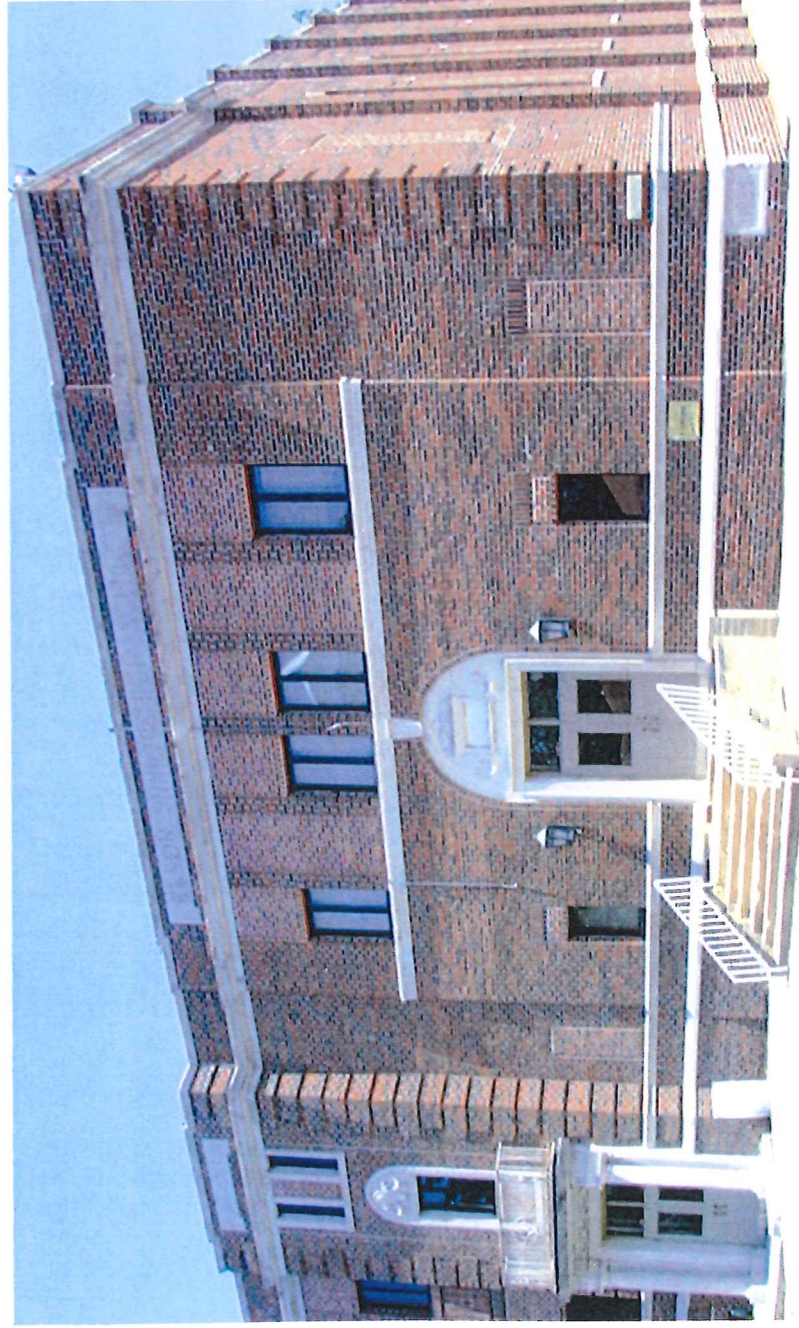


Classroom addition completed in 2009 to the existing elementary school building to serve special education students. The project included three classrooms, toilets, kitchen, offices and storage space. Also included was the remodeling of one existing classroom for the home base program.



Marshalltown Community School District – Marshalltown Learning Academy

Marshalltown, Iowa



Created in 2008 in the Anson Junior High School Building, the Marshalltown Learning Academy (MLA) serves nearly 100 non-traditional, at-risk, secondary students.

MLA serves those young adults who need a flexible schedule in an alternative learning environment offering students in grades 9 through 12 the opportunity to earn high school diplomas.

Uinta County School District #1 – Horizon Alternative High School Evanston, Wyoming

The Horizon Alternative High School is an adaptive reuse of a former call center and prior to that a former Pamida store.

The 33,000 square foot building houses the Horizon Alternative High School, food service, maintenance, technology, print shop and warehouse space. Horizon is a Grade 7-12 alternative school for at-risk youth in the Evanston community with a student capacity of 70 students.

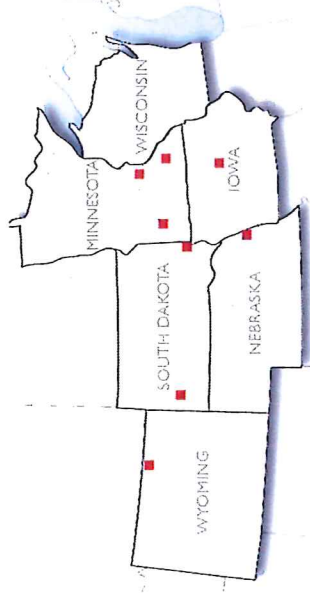
