150 Years Ago

In 1850 pioneers headed out west seeking land. The Donation Land Act offered settlers free land if they promised to live and farm the land. Married settlers got 320 acres, whereas single settlers got half (160 acres). As the pioneers came across the land, they passed through plains, rivers, steep mountainous terrain, and deserts. The wagons were not the traditional Conestoga wagons; their pick was the Prairie Schooner. This wagon had a tarp cover that was bathed in linseed oil.

In 1855-1856 the Rogue River Indian War took place and Fort Vannoy was a safe haven for volunteers and families, but also served as a military post. The fort itself was not fortified, instead it was a hastily built group of log cabins.

Fort Vannoy School was established in 1858-1859. The school was a one room log cabin. It originally stood on the property behind Ms. Angeli and Mr. Cowger's rooms. That area is now fenced off and the building is no longer standing. Today our mascot is the "Fort Vannoy Indian." "The Outlaws" was the mascot prior to the Indian.
