President Lori Ann Garza reported that "under the State Board of Education Rule, completing the required continuing education each year of service is a basic obligation and the expectation of any sitting board member. #### **ENROLLMENT AND ATTENDANCE**

Dr. Marc Puig reported that the enrollment for the 2025-2026 school year was at 93.2% vs. the 2024-2025 school year at 92.5%. As of October 10, 2025, the percentage of attendance was up. Also, the enrollment for the 2025-2026 school year had eighty-four fewer students than the previous school year. The reason for the drop is that students are moving and some are being home-schooled.

**ACADEMIC UPDATE/TIA UPDATE**

Josh Garcia reported that they have been reviewing the school district's strategic plan, which has not changed. The administration will also be looking at the four pillars. The money that they received from the Robstown Education Foundation will be used towards coaching. The administration will be coached by Robert Stell, and in return, they will train their staff. They have completed a total of 324 learning walks, and 165 coaching lessons have been held across the school district. Jacqueline Padilla reported that this year school at Lotspeich Leadership Academy they are working on academics by conducting learning walks and focusing on the four pillars. They are conducting face-to-face coaching sessions, and after the learning walks, they will discuss collaboratively what resources are needed to help with the lessons. Maribel Trevino reported that everything that her administration and staff do supports the Tier I Instruction. The learning walks are Tier I, and the important part is to follow up after the visit to make sure that the staff is doing what is expected of them, and if they still need help. Diana Silvas reported that the TIA Journey continues. Today, they met with San Pedro Fine Arts Academy TIA eligible teachers. Their main focus at this time is to meet with the teachers who have qualified. On October 10th, the TIA team visited Robert Driscoll Stem Academy, and after they finish with San Pedro, they will go back and finish at Robert Driscoll. A meeting will be held to update the handbook.

**M & O UPDATE**

Ron Lawver reported that they had completed the gym at the Seale Jr. High School. They fixed the lights, some of the floor, the bleachers, and it has been painted all red. Anisa Chavera reported that she was happy to see the gym completed, and they will start hosting volleyball games. Mr. Lawver also informed the Board that he has received all of the warranties for the roofing project, and he has created files for all of the warranties that he has received. He will be submitting his operational report in December.

Dr. Marc Puig reported that there has been a shift in how to approach the superintendent's goals. The approach was to move from Smart Goals to System Goals. The Smart Goals measure outcomes after the fact, the System Goals measure the daily processes that cause those outcomes, and the accountability shifts from what happened to what is being improved at the time. The system goals should be aligned with the vision. He reviewed the following three system goals that are aligned with the school district's vision for their consideration: 1) Goal 1: Strengthen Instructional Brilliance - This goal will help in building a district-wide framework of instructional brilliance with high impact teaching practices supported through coaching, reflection, and collaboration, 2) Goal 2: Ensure Curricular Brilliance through HQIM Implementation - This goal will guarantee every student access to a coherent, high-quality curriculum anchored in High-Quality Instructional Materials and protected collaborative planning time, and 3) Goal 3: Advance Literacy Brilliance PK-12 - This goal will help in implementing a vertically aligned literacy framework. After discussion, the board members asked Dr. Puig to add a fourth goal that would state that the school district's rating would be increased by seven points, from a 68 to 75, for the 2025-2026 school year. He informed the Board that he meets with the individual principals weekly. At these meetings, they discuss their goals, the progress that they have made, how the school district can support them, and instruction. Also, he reported that the Texas Education Agency will be visiting Seale Jr. High School on November 6, 2025. 2025.
