BOARD GOAL: Keller Independent School District facilities and services will

FISCAL NOTE: Bond Funds

Background Information:

- At the March 28, 2005 Board meeting, Halbach Dietz Architects was selected as the
 architectural firm to prepare contract documents for code compliance work at Keller
 Learning Center. This facility was also slated to receive an addition in the 2005 Bond
 Program. The addition was scheduled to be completed in 2006 when the second sale of
 bonds was complete; however, the bonds were sold in a single issue making money for
 this addition available now.
- It would be beneficial to incorporate all work at this facility into one project. This would create less down time and disruption at the site, and could save money through omission of doubled indirect job cost.
- Projecting the savings estimate is limited due to the construction methodology used on this project.
- This project is being developed as a competitive sealed proposal delivery and was approved at the Facilities Committee meeting on August 30, 2005.

Administrative Considerations:

- It is necessary to select an architectural firm to prepare contract documents for the addition to Keller Learning Center.
 - A recommendation was presented and approved at the August 30, 2005 Facilities
 Committee meeting to retain Halbach Dietz Architects for the code compliance
 work competitive sealed proposal project with the addition at Keller Learning
 Center.
- The budget for the construction portion of the work is \$673,612 with an architectural fee of 7%.

The administration recommends that the Board of Trustees approve combining the code compliance work competitive sealed proposal project with the addition project and approve Halbach – Dietz Architects as the architectural firm for the addition to KISD Learning Center.
