

# School Security Officers will continually be trained to meet District, State and TCOLE requirements.

Through the Denton Police Department partnership, training needs and support will be met.

Types of Training: Safe School Training, ALLERT, CPR-FIRST AID-AED, FEMA-NIMS Incident Command, Campus Emergency Operation Planning, Standard Response Protocols, Monitoring of the campus, interior and exterior doors and grounds, Building Emergency Response Team Leadership (BERT), Security Camera use, Campus Building Audits, Exterior Door Audit Checks, Weapons, and TCOLE mandated 40 hours of training in a two-year cycle





## School Security Officer Vision

Campuses assignments for the SSOs have been prioritized based upon location to ease the rover component of our current SROs and to provide priority first response.

The School Security Officers will bring needed support to our campuses by being the resident expert for the security of the campus. This alleviates some of duties currently fulfilled by our administrators and builds consistency throughout the district with the measures that are in place to safeguard our students, staff and visitors on campus.
