Attendance

The COSSA attendance team has been meeting weekly to discuss students at risk of violating the attendance policy and to identify the best means to support these students. Our attendance point person (Sam) contacts students/families daily with students with more than one absence. If these calls are not answered or returned, we arrange a parent/guardian meeting or conduct a home visit. We continue this process until the student exceeds the allowed absences under our policy.

Our current attendance average for the year is 89% (for the high school) and 78% for junior high. We have had some success with these efforts. We recognize the challenge but are encouraged by the increase in our attendance averages (in the 50 percent range last year) and the responses we have received from the families and students. In short, we are preventing students from falling through the cracks and are making a concerted effort to reach out to all students who are at risk. Academically, we will focus on catching at-risk students quicker in our weekly teacher meetings and addressing their needs through academic probation, academic success, etc.

Speaking of Academic Success, our after-school program, we have significantly increased attendance with a more focused effort in notifying parents during our advisory periods. The advisory teacher conducts a weekly grade check and has students call home if they are below 60% in any class. Our buses now provide transportation to 10 to 15 students on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. Some students attend on Tuesday to be eligible for club participation on Wednesday.

Some other highlights from the Academy:

- Student council has been a positive force and will propose a new school mascot.
- A car show is being held to promote COSSA and to raise funds for lighting/seating for our new basketball court.
- Students will begin playing on the court (painted by engineering) starting Monday, October 16th.
- Student council, with support from engineering, has designed t-shirts to produce schoolappropriate merchandise for fundraising and school spirit.
- We have experienced no fighting or drug activity on the campus but have suspended some students for intimidation or aggressive behaviors.
- With those students, we do a reintegration meeting with the family before they can return to the campus and emphasize education and restorative practices.
