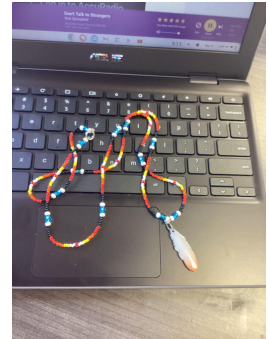
Students are learning different ways to do earrings that don't require a lot of beading.

Necklaces made by a student. They are able to pick their colors and how long it's going to be for a student or adult.



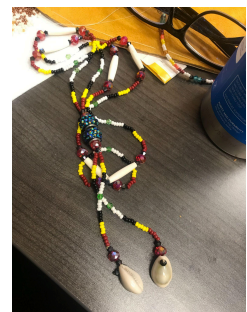

Students learned how to make a necklace with two ends using shells for the ends. Also this is where they used bone beads.

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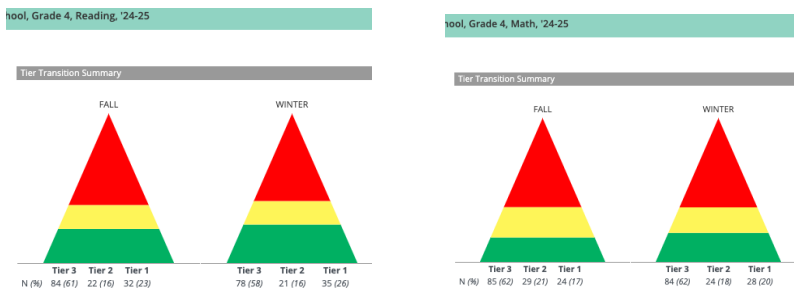

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Instructional Coaches

Happy New Year! What a great beginning to a new year! Although we didn't have a 'White Christmas', we did welcome the much-needed snow! We began the new year with a bang and hit the ground running! We completed our final progress monitoring for Oral Reading Fluency and Math fluency using the Aimsweb platform. The coaches assisted with engagement PD with our mentor Julie Gavin. Although we needed to adjust our original schedule, our participation was attended by teachers from both grade levels. The instructional coaches were also diligent in readjusting the ELA framework, pacing guide, and instructional lesson plans as we began implementing a 10-day instructional cycle for all aspects of ELA, including grammar, spelling, fluency, phonics, and comprehension. We will begin our full 2nd cycle at the beginning of February. The instructional coaches have also planned and implemented a new 'Walk to Math' framework and cycle of instruction formulated from the MAST data to ensure all fourth-grade students are being provided foundational skills in place value and numeration. This will be implemented the first week of February as well, and both coaches will continue to provide support. Both coaches continue to provide support to teachers and currently have 8 continuous coaching cycles in place. The Aimsweb winter benchmark took place and to date, we have 99% of both grade levels assessed and progress monitoring goals have been set for the 2nd semester.
