### **How We Got Here**

# 86th Legislative Session 2019

- HB3 provided significant changes to the school funding formula
- Intended to increase funding for all schools
- Formula Transition Grant was established for schools that did not realize an increase in funding
- Change from prior year to current year TAV

### **How We Got Here**

# 88th Legislative Session 2023

- Record budget surplus at State level
- No increase in the Basic Allotment since 2019 despite record inflation levels
- No relief for Formula Transition Grant districts
- A Special Sessions with no action to school funding
- Property Tax Relief passed in the 2nd special session



## Impact on 2024-2025 Budget

- Series of School Board Workshops (February June) outline administration efforts to reduce the deficit
- Reduced the deficit from \$4.5M to \$400K by:
  - Elimination of certain categories of support staff
  - Reduction of departmental and campus budgets
  - Reduced compensation plan
  - Class size increases at secondary schools
  - Fee increases, etc.
- Board Approved One-Time Compensation Plan that increased deficit to \$1.29M





# Impact on 2024-2025 Budget Today

- Enrollment exceeded projections
- Added additional classroom teachers
- Added additional support positions
- Added additional compensation pending Board approval
- Balanced budget pending Board approval
