Dear Parents and Guardians,

As we enter the **final trimester of the school year**, we want to keep you informed about important upcoming events.

With the inclement weather days at the beginning of February, we have adjusted our schedule a bit. The end of the second trimester prior to these days was on March 6. Now, the end of the second trimester is March 14. Teachers will have grades completed by the end of the day, and report cards will be sent out the following week. May 6–May 9: Students in grades 6-8 will take the Math Test in their Math Classroom.
May 12–May 14, and May 19–May 21: Students in grades 6-8 will take the English Language Arts test in the ELA classrooms.

Robotics bootcamp is coming! Any interested 6th, 7th, or 8th grader is invited to apply. Applications (found in the library or by contacting Ms. Harmon) will be accepted until March 12th permission forms will then be handed out to students who show that they are excited to participate in Robotics next year. Bootcamp will be after school for four days (3:45-6PM) from Monday the 17th of March to Thursday the 20th.

NKN Robotics attended their final event of the season on Feb. 22nd and 23rd - the SPARK Invitational in Philomath. The students attending showed a great deal of resilience and grit managing to overcome a large number of mechanical and programming challenges during the weekend. Their performance wasn't strong enough to earn a ticket to the State Championships, but they didn't come home empty handed. The team earned a 2nd place Innovate award for their unique robot design.

This year is the first time that students have earned jackets by participating in two full seasons of Robotics at NKN. The jackets designed by Scovel's Ink have embroidered patches on them for the team sponsors and to identify our team at competition. It is so exciting to have everyone coordinated at competition and it will be wonderful moving forward to have these jackets for all our dedicated participants.
