BQ (LEGAL)





A board shall ensure that a district improvement plan and improvement plans for each campus are developed, reviewed, and revised annually for the purpose of improving the performance of all students. A board shall annually **approve district and campus performance objectives** and shall ensure that the district and campus plans:

- 1. Are mutually supportive to accomplish the identified objectives; and
- 2. At a minimum, support the state goals and objectives under Education Code Chapter 4.

Strategic Plan Alignment



The district and campus improvement plan priorities and objectives are aligned with the district strategic plan.

PRIORITY ONE

STUDENT ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Increase the percentage of third-grade students meeting grade level on STAAR Reading from 34% to 43% by 2028.

Increase the percentage of third-grade students meeting grade level on STAAR Math from 27% to 35% by 2028.

Improve the district accountability rating for Domain II (School Progress) from 72% to 80% by 2028.

PRIORITY TWO

STUDENTS, FAMILIES, AND COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS

Increase the percentage of students graduating college and/or career-ready from 89% to 96% by 2028.

Increase the average student attendance from 91.8% to 94% by 2028.

Increase the number of students meeting TSI from 11% to 21% by 2028.

PRIORITY THREE

PERSONNEL AND PROFESSIONAL

Increase the number of teachers receiving a TIA distinction from 0 to 60 by 2028.

Increase the percentage of teachers holding a valid Texas certification from 85% to 89% by 2028.

Increase the retention of certified teachers from 79% to 82% by 2028.

PRIORITY FOUR

FISCAL STEWARDSHIP AND OPERATIONAL EXCELLENCE

Increase instructional expenditures (Function 11) from 52.74% to 60% by 2028.

Improve School FIRST rating from an A-90 to A-94 by 2028.

Reduce payroll expenditures by 5% from 85.36% to 80.36% by 2028.

2025-2026 District Objectives



Priority 1: Student Academic Success

- Increase the percentage of third-grade students meeting grade level on STAAR Reading from 34% to 37% by 2026.
- Increase the percentage of third-grade students meeting grade level on STAAR Math from 27% to 30% by 2026.
- Improve the district accountability rating for Domain II (School Progress) from 72% to 75% by 2026.

Priority 2: Students, Families, and Community Connections

- The percent of graduating college, career, or military ready (CCMR) will increase from 89% to 91.5% by June 2026.
- The average student attendance will increase from 91.8% to 92.5% by June 2026.
- The percent of students meeting Texas Success Initiative (TSI) without College Bridge will increase from 11% to 14.3% by June 2026.

Priority 3: Personnel and Professional Development

- The number of teachers receiving a TIA distinction will increase from 0 to 20 by June 2026.
- The percentage of teachers holding a valid Texas Certification will increase from 85% to 86.3% by 2026.
- The retention rate of "certified teachers" will increase from 79% to 80% by 2026.

Priority 4: Fiscal Stewardship and Operational Excellence

- The amount of funds spent on "instructional expenditures (Function 11)" will increase from 52.74% to 55.16% by 2026.
- The district will improve the School FIRST rating from an A-90 to A-91 by 2026.
- The district will reduce payroll expenditures by 5% from 85.36% to 83.7% by 2026.
