Tracy Bell, Director of Curriculum and Instruction, reports on the following:

Strategic Goal 2: Instructional Supports

Over the past quarter, the Curriculum Department has focused on improving instructional alignment, strengthening teacher supports, and ensuring clarity in curriculum implementation across the district.

Objective 1: Evaluation of Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS)

Recent progress includes:

- Updating our districtwide MTSS Plan to be more structured and clearer for staff.
- Developing a dashboard to better track student interventions and success.
- Improving Positive Behavior Systems with guidance from the Safe & Civil Schools consultant.
- Designing professional development schedules to build staff skills in intervention and data use.

Objective 2: Safe & Civil Schools Refresh

- Consultant Susan Isaacs has nearly completed her visits to our communities. She was unable to visit Kiana and Noatak due to weather and scheduling.
- In Kotzebue, she will work with leadership to plan behavior support systems for the 2025–26 school year.
- For the 2025–26 school year, the consultant's focus will shift to helping schools build consistent expectations, staff routines, and positive behavior supports tailored to each site's needs.

Curriculum Program & Project Updates:

1. PK-12 Curriculum Alignment & Planning Tools

- Completed full-year pacing and scope and sequence documents for ELA, Math, Science, and Social Studies (K–5), fully aligned to the Alaska State Standards.
- Integrated thematic units and culturally responsive content across disciplines, with intentional connections to SEL and Iñupiaq values.
- Developed teacher-facing planning tools that include success criteria, learning targets, and links to progress monitoring, ensuring instruction is both standards-based and studentcentered.

2. Literacy Connections (LIT) Grant Progress

- Created a clear plan for continuing our literacy work next year, including supports for students and families.
- Hired new staff who will help with reading programs, family engagement, and making sure our literacy goals stay on track. Onboarding will start July 1.
- Finalized purchase of take-home literacy kits for families. In July the team will organize them for implementation to families and teachers next year.

3. MTSS & Alaska Reads Act Readiness

- Developed ELA Tier I–III guidance and documentation for school-level teams, including intervention program inventories, grouping protocols, and scheduling templates.
- Collaborated closely with the Student Services Department to align Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS) responsibilities in preparation for the upcoming transition.

4. Department Systems

- Completed a districtwide instructional materials inventory, organized by subject and grade band, with documentation of format, subscription status, and instructional alignment.
- Prepared central storage and curriculum materials for summer cleaning and fall onboarding, including clear documentation for teachers.
- Provided transition memos and updated shared drives to support sustainability and ease of handoff to incoming leadership.
