A.C. Houghton Elementary

After-School Program

We have recently completed a study of the effectiveness of our After-School programming. We compared 13 students who had maintained an attendance/enrollment level of 70% from the beginning of the third-grade to the beginning of the fourth grade, with 13 randomly selected students who had not attended the After-school Program at all. Students who had not attended the after-school program gained an average of 8.6 State benchmark points which was about 123% of the normal seven .growth for the year. The same group gained seven Rit points which was the normal reading growth for the year. The students who had been part of the After-School Program gained an average of 10.15 ..increase in math which was 145% of normal and 8.15 in reading which was 117% of normal growth.

The curriculum for this program is Accelerated Reader comprehension building for the reading half and Math Pop-up basic facts building for the math part. Two 30 minute sessions are tightly organized by a group of six adults who work with our kids each day. Those students maintaining exceptional attendance have a special 30 minute PE activity on Thursdays as a continual incentive to be part of the program. Program attendance has averaged in the 47-53 range.

On behalf of the ACH students and staff, we hope everybody has a great holiday season.

Mr. Thompson brought up the concept of redirecting traffic to a location near the tennis courts and closing off Stansbury completely. This was met with favor by ODOT and many people have the same safety

concerns with a road running through the middle of a school campus. ODOT stated that it would be easier to connect Elder to the highway than reconstructing the entrance at Stansbury. The city also had positive comments and is willing to looking at how to make this a reality.

Riverside teachers will again be available to assist students on Friday, December 8th from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. This is an excellent opportunity for students to receive individual assistance. We hope that parents will review their student's report card with them and encourage them to use this time to receive the additional help that is being made available during this time.

RIVERSIDE'S NO "F" POLICY

Beginning third quarter, Riverside will be implementing a new policy to assist and encourage students with an "F" in one or more classes to improve their grades. On January 29th, all students who received an "F" during 2nd quarter will be required to attend a special study period during their lunch.

Junior high students receiving an "F" will report to the auditorium during their lunch with homework or an AR book. High school students receiving an "F" will also be required to report to the auditorium during their lunch with homework or an AR book and will not be allowed to leave campus.

Grades will be re-checked every two weeks. Students who have improved their grades will be excused from the special study period. However, if their grades drop below a "D" at any time during the subsequent two week checks, they will be required to return to the special study periods.

In addition, any junior high student with an "F" in a core class at the semester will be required to attend after school remediation during 2nd Semester.

ELL Program

This month I finished doing the observation and post observations will all ELL teachers in the district. I witnessed lots of good teaching and emerging teaching within our schools. My hope is to see our district report cards in each school reflect the fact that now every identified ELL student is now getting more English instruction with teachers across our district.

I have finished my first round of ELL teacher observation and I am resolved to maintain the best ESL team of teachers in the State of Oregon. Our teachers went to the last training at the ESD with Jacquie Johnson and a team of ESL teachers in the region who are finishing the training of giving ELD by Susan Dutro. By these trainings our teachers are gaining a better approach on teaching ELD to students.

Also last month, a team of ESL teachers from the district attended the ELL Curriculum Caravan at the Pendleton Convention Center. We evaluated several ESL curriculums as the publishers gave short presentations. Each person submitted to me their choices for curriculum, and I have asked publishers to send us samples of their curriculums. Later in January, our ESL teachers will meet for half a day and review the materials and choose specific curriculums to teach across the school district.

For parent meetings, the ESL program invited Ninfa Murrillo the Director of Multicultural Programs from Linfield College and her and another college delivered an informational meeting to about 25 parents at Sam Boardman Elementary in how to get your child prepared to go to college. They also informed parents about financial aid and the process to apply for scholarships, grants, and loans. Parents asked that they return and help them in the process of applying for FASFA, making applications for grants and scholarships.

The ELL director also met with Jason Wood of B.M.C.C. in order to support a joint effort in the Family Education Night at Sam Boardman Elementary. Our plan is to start a Family Education Night also in Irrigon in February 2007. We are meeting with citizens of Irrigon in order to plan our course of action to get ESL, U.S. Citizenship, school age child education, and younger child literacy also at Irrigon. This is to show compliance that the district has support activity towards parent and family education.
