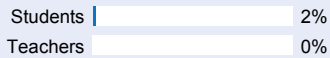

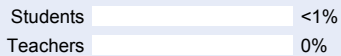

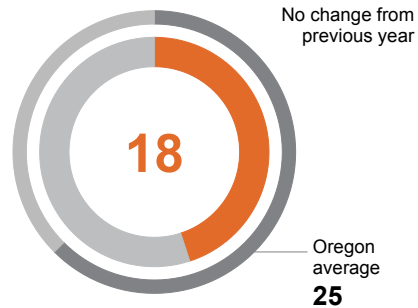

School Environment

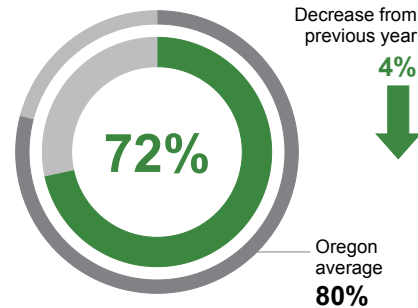
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

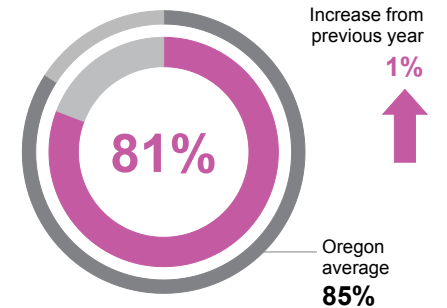
Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

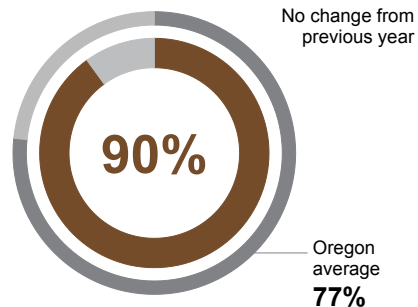
Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.

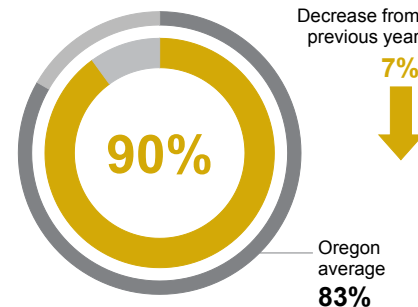
ON-TIME GRADUATION

School Goals

Every student will improve their reading fluency towards proficiency, meeting grade level targets or reading at or above 180 wpm. Every student will be safe, responsible, and respectful.

Every student will improve math skills towards proficiency. Every student will understand the consequences of inadequate sleep, and the connections between videogames, caffeine, and mental health.

Improve number of students 'On Track' to graduation (90% attendance, 7 credits earned per year)

Increase awareness of mental health issues and the impact on student success in school and in the community.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is working in partnership with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

We are a PBIS school and are a partner in SAFEOREGON. We host special Freshman, Senior, Junior and Sophomore orientation meetings at the beginning of each school year in order to share essential information, invite parent participation and promote positive and proactive communication throughout the year. This year we are planning a phone outreach effort to make personal connections with all parents to make sure they know about the activities and resources available to support student success. We have expanded the number of student forums to discuss topics of interest and concern.

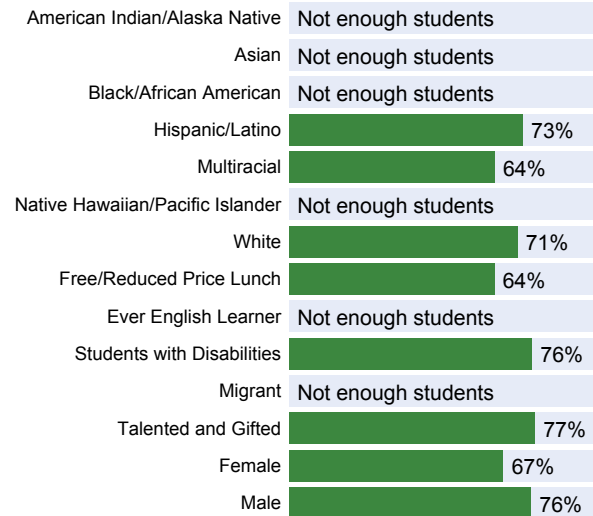

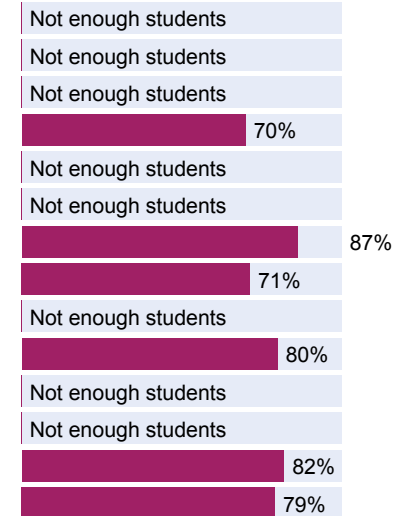

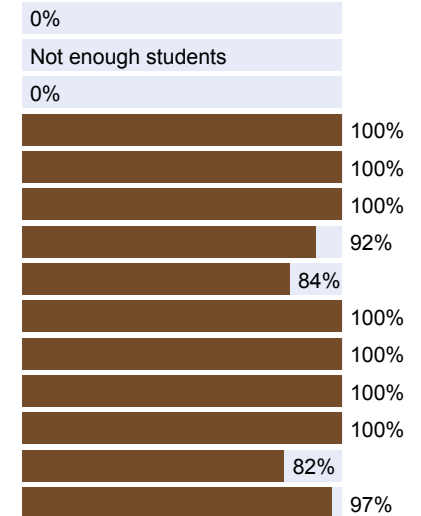
