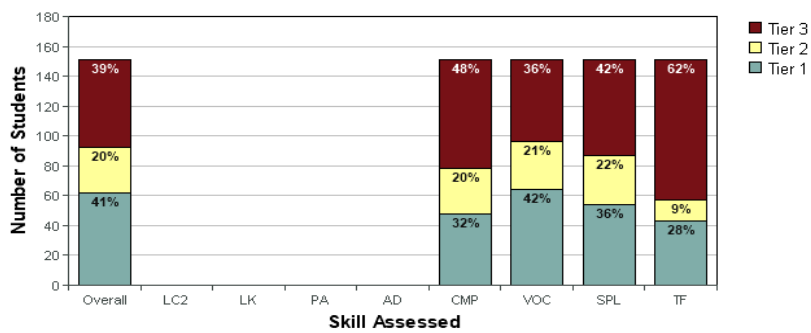

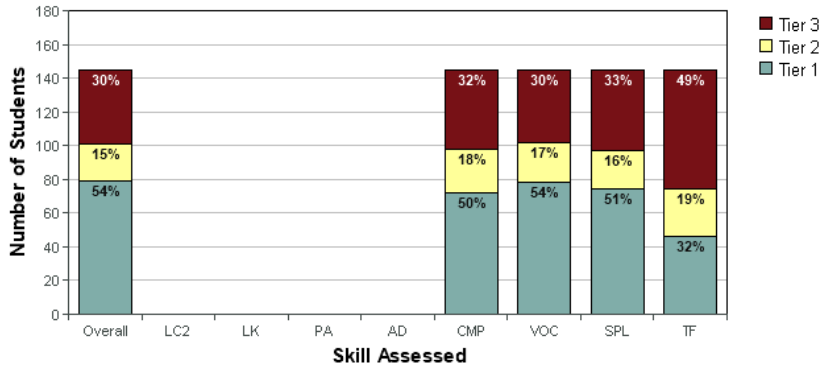
Principal's Goal Increase Proficient by 15% and

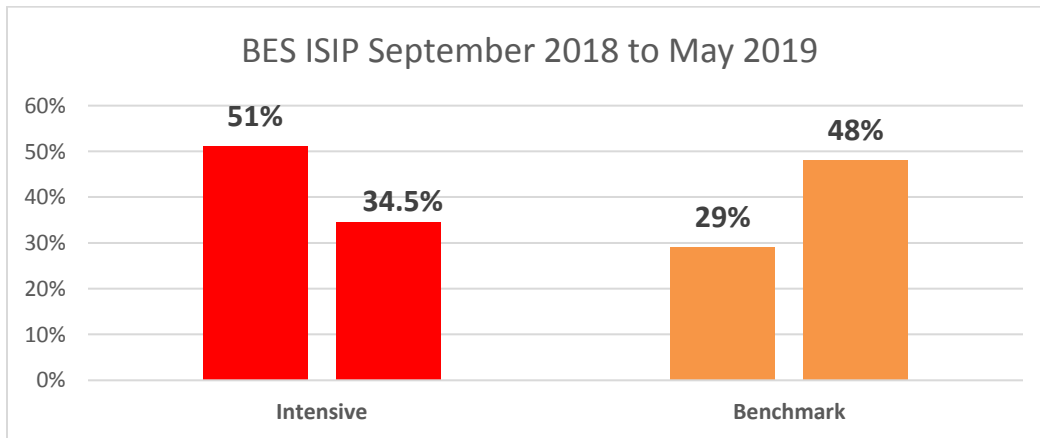
- 2nd Grade decreased intensive 13% from September 2018 to May 2019
- 2nd Grade missed their grade level goal by just 2%
- 2nd Grade increased benchmark 12% from September 2018 to May 2019
- 2nd Grade needed to increase 3% to meet the grade level goal of 44%

3rd Grade - May 2019

- 3rd Grade decreased intensive by 30% from Sept to May and needed to decrease 4% to meet their grade level goal
- 3rd Grade increased benchmark by 15% from Sept to May and surpassed their grade level goal by 6%

- BES met the Principal’s instructional goal for benchmark by increasing 19%

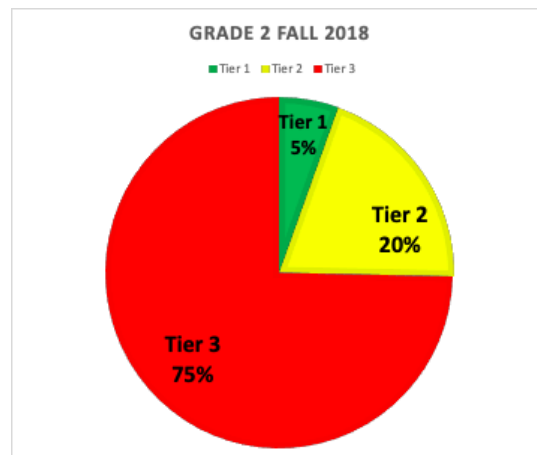
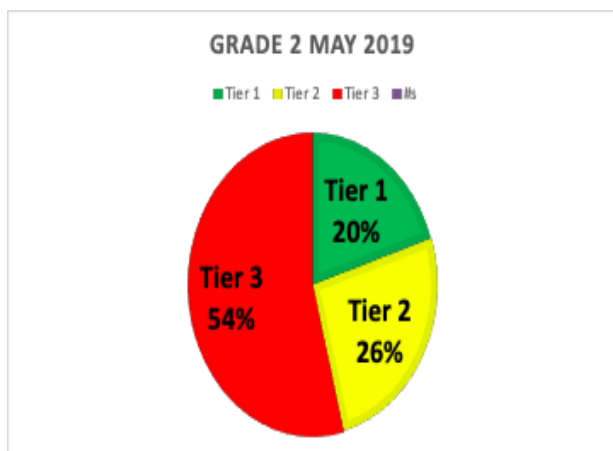
STAR Math assessment Goals

- Decrease **Intensive** by 15% in Math on STARMath by May 2019



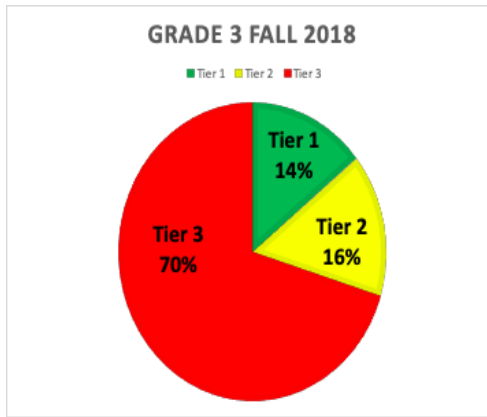
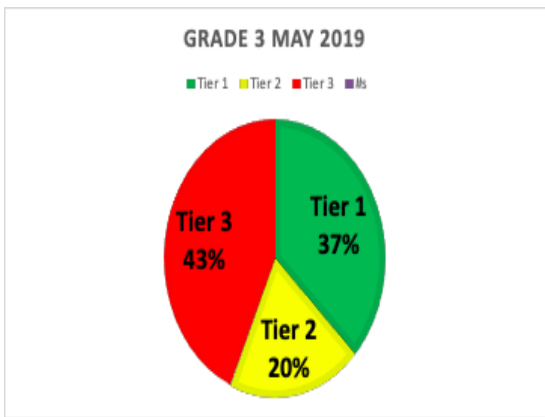
2nd Grade STAR Math for March

From September to May, second grade increased proficient by 15% and decreased intensive by 21%.



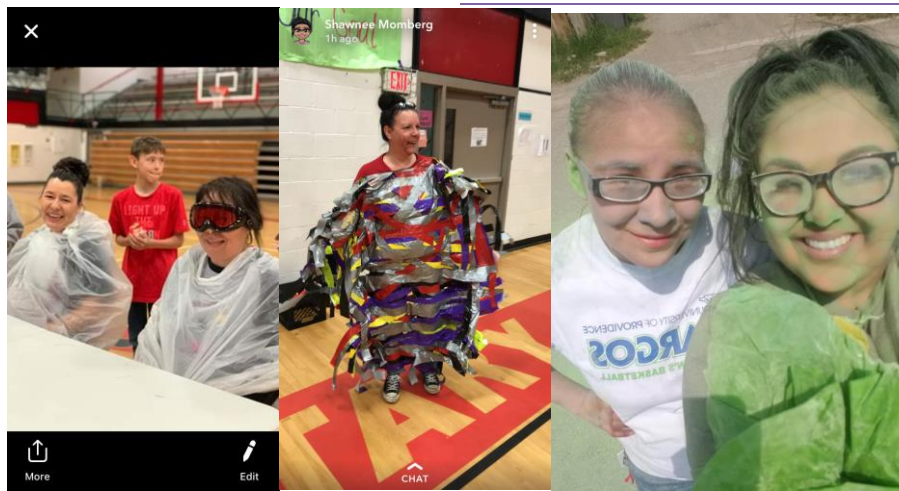
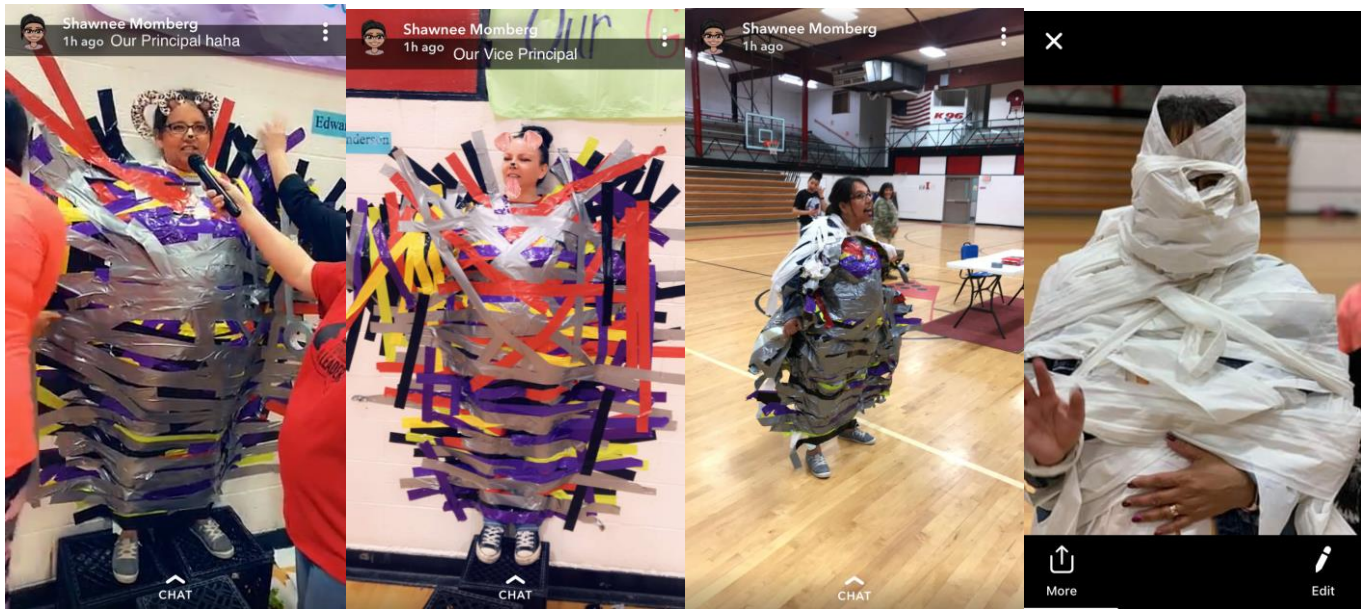
3rd Grade STAR Math for March

From September to May, third grade increased proficient by 23% and decreased intensive by 27%.

Attendance Data

Principal Goal: Decrease 40+ attendance list by 10 % by May 2019.



We had 88 on the 40+ attendance list and we needed to reduce that by 8.8 or 9 students. We had 27 with less than 40 absences this year! Our staff had a plan to make solid relationships with these students and it is showing some positive results.

Writing Data

Principal Goal: Increase students who score benchmark on the writing assessment by 10%.



Last year we had 4 students score benchmark and this year we had 8 students. We raised that by 50%

Principal Goal: Increase students who improve their writing score by 1 pt.

Last year we had 50 students and this year we fell short with only 28 students.

Referral Data

Principal Goal: Decrease referrals by 15% by May 2019

Last year we had 172 referrals and this year we had 175 referrals. 91 came from the classroom while 49 happened during recess. 77 were for insubordination and 32 were for altercation (minor).
