Beverly Forney (Business and Computer Science)

We had a very successful student event in February, serving free pizza to our students. We welcomed PSU Registration and Advising so that students could apply for admission for free. Dual Enrollment information was also provided for Business and CS transfer students. FT and AF Faculty were on hand to answer any student questions and for promotion of our CTE Programs. FT Business Faculty Michael Moiso is starting free, business start-up advice/consultation for veterans through our VA Center.

Eric Lee (Engineering)

I wanted to share that Advising (Emily Melgoza and Summer Baber) and Engineering have paired up to do Group Advising Sessions as a small part of a class grade for the second-year engineering students. These sessions are happening outside of class and are focused on ensuring students are on track for graduation and are transfer ready (housing, transportation, scholarships, etc). This is our second year doing this, and we have had great success and hope to continue! Combined with a requirement to meet advisers at the beginning of their education in the Intro to Engineering class, we are ensuring that students get the essential advice they need to be successful at CCC and beyond. The model is working very well for the engineering program, and I think it could be easily exported to any other program with a cohort of transfer students.

Jane Littlefield (CCC Library)

CCC Library secured a Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) Strong Libraries Mini Grant to purchase Spanish-language materials to be added to the library collection. The purchases will focus on adding to our “Tough Topics” collection which contains resources on subjects that can be difficult for students to ask about, books that help students strengthen study skills and support college success, and related translations on our website to spread the words to students.

Update from the Full-Time Faculty Bargaining Team:

Full-time faculty, along with associate faculty and classified, continue to work diligently to help the college address its budget concerns. During February, all three employee groups collectively aired concerns about the administration’s decision to hire external counsel at a rate of \$350/hour to serve as chief negotiator for bargaining with all three associations. We are happy that administration heard employee feedback and that those concerns were a contributing factor in the college reversing this decision.
