BACKGROUND INFORMATION

For elementary campuses, we complete the Paid Lunch Equity (PLE) Tool published by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). The tool determines what our paid lunch price minimum will be at our campuses that participate in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP). It is designed to ensure revenue from "paid" students provides an equitable amount of funds to the nonprofit food service account when compared to the revenue from free and reduced-price meals. For secondary campuses, USDA requires that meals not receiving federal reimbursement must be priced at least the same amount as all funds received from a paid NSLP meal. In addition to the lack of federal funding at our secondary campuses, we also offer larger portions and many premium items; therefore, a price increase is necessary in order to prevent a deficit in the coming school year.

BUDGETARY IMPACT & FUNDING SOURCE

Increasing the meal prices ensures enough revenue to cover the costs of operation.

Elementary Campuses

- Breakfast \$2.35 (\$0.10 increase)
- Lunch \$4.00 (\$0.25 increase)

Secondary Campuses and Adult Meals

- Sixth Grade Center and Middle School
 - Breakfast \$2.60 (\$0.10 increase)
 - Lunch \$5.00 (\$0.25 increase)
- High School
 - Breakfast \$2.60 (\$ 0.10 increase)
 - Lunch \$5.00 (\$0.25 increase)
 - The Market (Made to Order Deli) \$5.25 (no increase)
