Our students are striving to continue to show positive behaviors, however staff continue to teach the expectations in the various settings when needed. I feel that MBI has had an impact on the number of student referrals We had 1 referral at this time last year and we have matched that this year. In working with students the staff are working hard at implementing intervention and prevention strategies for our students. Our students and staff are doing a great job.

We will start our Environmental program with a field trip with Ranger Kelly in the Rising Sun area. They will learn about fire ecology, the fall foliage, bears (lots of signs of them on the trail), geology and how animals prepare for winter.
