- Students in 6th, 7th and 8th grades completed benchmarking the week before spring break in math and reading while 8th graders completed benchmarking in science and history as well.
- Four sixth grade students from OMS have qualified for state competition in calculator skills sponsored by the Texas Math & Science Coaches Association. Garry Held, Julie Marshall, Kamryn Lozano and Rachel Mendoza will be competing at the state level in San Antonio on Friday and Saturday April 8th and 9th. This is the first year Ozona Middle School has competed in the Texas Math & Science Coaches Association competition. Students are being coached by Ernie Rivera.
- OMS has begun hosting a series of Parent Academic Nights. This past Monday, parents had the opportunity to visit with OMS math department teachers from 6:00p.m. – 6:45p.m. On Tuesday night, parents visited with OMS language arts teachers. The purpose of OMS Parent Academic Nights is for teachers and parents to communicate and collaborate on strategies that parents can use at home to increase their child’s academic success. The next OMS Parent Academic Night will be Monday March 28 for discussions on science and Tuesday March 29 to discuss Social Studies.
