

School Nutrition Lunch Prices for SY21-22

Elementary Campuses

We are pleased to announce that we will be continuing the Community Eligibility Provision to all elementary campuses this year. The Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) is a non-pricing meal service option for schools and school districts in low-income areas. CEP allows the nation's highest poverty schools and districts to serve breakfast and lunch at no cost to all enrolled students without collecting household applications. Instead, schools that adopt CEP are reimbursed using a formula based on the percentage of students categorically eligible for free meals based on their participation in other specific means-tested programs, such as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF).

Secondary Campuses

We are also pleased to announce that we will be continuing USDA's Universal Free Feeding Program for SY21-22 for all secondary campuses. This program requires that we still collect Free/Reduced meal applications from this group of households (for reimbursement purposes) but allows us to provide breakfast and lunch meals at no cost to all secondary students.

Adult Meal Prices

The charge for adult meals must, at a minimum, be greater than the amount of total reimbursement received for a free meal plus any other supplemental payments received by the our district plus per-meal value of USDA Foods (Commodities) used for our meal service. The adult meal prices listed below meet the minimum requirements.

Breakfast-\$3.00

Lunch-\$4.25
