## AGENDA ITEM: Deferring the 15% Rule

**ALIGNS TO BOARD GOAL(S):** Aligns to Board Goal #1 – Students will meet or exceed educational performance standards

## **Background Information:**

- 2007- SB 1301 calls for the creation of End of Course Exams
- 2009 HB 3 calls for the use of EOC scores in the calculation of final course averages
- December, 2010 TEA releases the HB 3 transition plan
- Summer, 2011 Legislature called to special session. House overwhelmingly approves HB 500 to allow districts local control over the EOC grading guidelines (among other items). However, Shapiro, Chair of the Senate Education Committee refused to let her committee consider a corresponding bill.
- August, 2011 TEA publishes an FAQ to help local districts write board policy for the STAAR/EOC testing program.
- October, 2011 TEA publishes an updated FAQ to clarify questions from the August FAQ document. The October update stated that STAAR testing should have a relationship with GPA and class rank (Although, TEA does not have the statutory authority to tell districts how to establish grading guidelines, class rank, or GPA). Thirty of the seventy-five questions published on the October FAQ changed from information provided to districts in the August FAQ.
- January, 2012 mid-winter conference. Commission Scott states in a general session speech that if he "had the authority he would delay the requirement that the EOC test scores count as 15% of the final course average."
- February 22, 2012 Districts received official notice from Commissioner Scott that the application of the EOC grade as 15% of the final course average could be deferred for the 2011-2012 school year.
- February 23, 2012 Districts were notified of a May 1<sup>st</sup> deadline for declaring their intent for the 15% rule.
- Per TASB recommendation, Board action is required prior to notifying Commissioner Scott of the District's intent concerning the 15% rule.

## Administrative Considerations:

• Legislators will once again revisit the 15% rule in the next legislative session and may make possible modifications to the rule or eliminate the requirement entirely.

FISCAL NOTE: There are no fiscal implications

Administrative Recommendation: Administration recommends the board defer the application of the EOC test as15% of the student's final grade for the 2011-2012 school year.
