



REQUEST FOR MENTORING SERVICES

FROM

GOVERNORS STATE UNIVERSITY'S METROPOLITAN INSTITUTE FOR LEADERSHIP IN EDUCATION (MILE) PROGRAM

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into on the date indicated below by and between the BOARD OF EDUCATION OF SPEED SEJA 802 (hereinafter "District") and the Metropolitan Institute for Leadership in Education/College of Education/Governors State University (hereinafter "Mentoring Provider").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Mentoring Provider is a State-approved provider of mentoring services; and


WHEREAS, the District desires to have a school leader receive professional development support and desires the Mentoring Provider to help facilitate this process.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

1. The Mentoring Provider agrees to provide a mentor for each school leader named in Section 2, below. The Mentoring Provider represents that the mentor has undergone the training required by the State of Illinois to serve as a mentor.
2. The District certifies that there are five school leaders in the District who will participate in the mentoring program through the Mentoring Provider. The names of the school leaders are April Brown, Sandra Brown, Janet DeBruin, Amina Payne and Nicole Taylor.
3. This Agreement shall remain in effect for the 2016-2017 school year.
4. The Parties understand that mentors and the Mentoring Provider are compensated for their services by the District. The District shall be required to pay a fee of \$2,180 for each participating school leader for mentoring services and a total of \$500 for professional development.
5. The District agrees not to file any lawsuit or other action or otherwise attempt to hold responsible the Mentoring Provider for mentoring services provided under this Agreement.

- 6. The District agrees to hold harmless and indemnify the Mentoring Provider if either party is named in a lawsuit or other action brought against the District or school leader resulting from the actions of the school leader.
- 7. The District understands that the mentor–school leader relationship is solely for the educational benefit of the school leader, and the District may not seek the mentor’s input regarding the school leader’s performance or otherwise contact the mentor without the express consent of the school leader.
